Section 397.482, Florida Statutes, is 21 created to read: 22 397.482 Gold Seal Quality Substance Abuse Treatment 23 Program. --24 (1) The department shall develop a two-tiered quality 25 rating system for substance abuse treatment programs. The Gold 26 Seal Quality rating shall be the highest quality rating, and 27 shall be awarded to qualified substance abuse treatment 28 providers pursuant to this section. 29 (2) To receive a separate Gold Seal Quality Substance 30 Abuse Treatment Program designation, and to operate as a Gold

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<u>Seal Substance Abuse Treatment Program, the following criteria</u> must be met:

- (a) The program must provide proof of accreditation by the Commission on Accreditation of Rehabilitation Facilities (CARF) or the Joint Commission on Accreditation of Health Care Organizations (JCAHCO), or through any other nationally recognized certification process that is acceptable to the department for those licensable components that are accredited. Programs or components that fail to maintain full accreditation shall be granted a period not to exceed 6 months to achieve full accreditation. The department shall rescind the designation should the program or a component fail to achieve full accreditation at the end of the 6-month period.
- (b) The program must exceed state target performance criteria specified in its contract with the department and pursuant to s. 216.0166 by 10 percent. The department shall rescind the designation should the program fail to achieve the required level of performance.
- (c) The program must meet all licensing requirements and standards pursuant to s. 397.403 and department rules.
- (d) The program must have been issued a regular license pursuant to s. 397.409(3) for at least 5 consecutive years.
- (3) The department shall establish procedures to reimburse substance abuse treatment programs under contract which hold a Gold Seal Quality Substance Abuse Treatment

 Program designation at an enhanced rate for substance abuse services provided to individuals who are eligible to receive services from the department. The enhanced rate of reimbursement shall be made available to programs that meet the criteria in paragraphs (2)(a)-(d). The amounts of

reimbursement at the enhanced rate shall be provided in performance contracting procedures established by the department and shall be allocated based on the availability of funds. The enhanced rate of reimbursement shall be rescinded by the department for a program which fails to meet the criteria in paragraphs (2)(a)-(d).

- (4) The department shall waive the annual licensure fee pursuant to s. 397.407 for a program that has achieved a Gold Seal Quality Substance Abuse Treatment Program designation. The waiver shall be rescinded by the department for a program which fails to meet the criteria in paragraphs (2)(a)-(d).
- Program designation expires at the end of each fiscal year and the program must reapply and provide proof that it meets the criteria described in paragraphs (2)(a)-(d) to renew the designation and receive the enhanced rate of reimbursement for services provided to eligible individuals.
- (6) The department shall rescind the Gold Seal designation should the program fail to demonstrate compliance with licensure standards as delineated in rules established by the department pursuant to the issuance of regular licenses.

Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2000.

HOUSE SUMMARY Directs the Department of Children and Family Services to establish a Gold Seal Quality rating for substance abuse treatment programs that meet specified criteria. Provides for designation of such programs as Gold Seal Quality Substance Abuse Programs. Requires the department to reimburse such programs at an enhanced rate of at least 25 percent above the standard prevailing rate. Provides for waiver of annual licensure fees for such programs, and for annual reapplication and renewal of the designation. Specifies conditions under which the department shall rescind the Gold Seal Quality designation, the enhanced rate of reimbursement, and the waiver of annual licensure fees for a program that fails to meet specified criteria or standards.
