Section 1. Subsection (4) is added to section 562.11, Florida Statutes, to read:

562.11 Selling, giving, or serving alcoholic beverages to person under age 21; misrepresenting or misstating age or age of another to induce licensee to serve alcoholic beverages to person under 21; penalties.--

(4) This section does not apply to a person who gives, serves, or permits to be served an alcoholic beverage to a student who is over 17 years of age, if the alcoholic beverage is delivered as part of the student's required curriculum at a postsecondary educational institution that is institutionally accredited by an agency recognized by the United States Department of Education and is either licensed or exempt from licensure by the State Board of Independent Colleges and Universities or that is a public postsecondary education institution; if the student is enrolled in the college and is required to taste alcoholic beverages that are provided only for instructional purposes during classes conducted under the

supervision of authorized instructional personnel pursuant to such a curriculum; if the alcoholic beverages are never 2 3 offered for consumption or imbibed by such a student and at all times remain in the possession and control of such 4 5 instructional personnel, who must be 21 years of age or older; 6 and if the college indemnifies the state and causes each 7 participating student to execute a waiver and consent in favor 8 of, and indemnifies and holds harmless, the state. 9 Section 2. Present subsection (2) of section 562.111, 10 Florida Statutes, is renumbered as subsection (3), and a new 11 subsection (2) is added to that section to read: 562.111 Possession of alcoholic beverages by persons 12 13 under age 21 prohibited. --(2) The prohibition against the possession of 14 15 alcoholic beverages which is set forth in this section does not apply to the tasting of alcoholic beverages by a student 16 17 who is over 17 years of age, who is tasting the alcoholic beverages as part of the student's required curriculum at a 18 19 postsecondary educational institution that is institutionally 20 accredited by an agency recognized by the United States Department of Education and is either licensed or exempt from 21 licensure by the State Board of Independent Colleges and 22 Universities or that is a public postsecondary education 23 24 institution, if the student is enrolled in the college and is 25 tasting the alcoholic beverages only for instructional purposes during classes that are part of such a curriculum; if 26 27 the student is allowed only to taste, but not consume or imbibe, the alcoholic beverages; and if the alcoholic 28 29 beverages at all times remain in the possession and control of authorized instructional personnel of the college, who must be 30 31 21 years of age or older.
