**Amendment (with title amendment)**

On page 31, between lines 17 and 18, of the bill

insert:

Section 17. (1) The Department of Health, in conjunction with other affected state agencies, shall develop a hepatitis A awareness and immunization program for food service establishments, day care centers and any other business setting in which the contraction of hepatitis A threatens the public health and safety. The immunization program shall be offered primarily through the county health departments and shall be a self-supporting program, funded by user fees. The Department of Health may work with pharmaceutical manufacturers and private associations in developing this program and in securing the hepatitis A vaccine at the lowest possible cost. As part of this program, the department shall distribute materials to potentially affected businesses and individuals.

1           (2) The Department of Revenue, in conjunction with the  
2 Department of Health and any other affected agencies, shall  
3 consider the feasibility of providing a state refund to  
4 businesses and individuals participating in the immunization  
5 program and report to the President of the Senate and the

7 such a program by January 1, 2001.
