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Section 1. Subsection (2) of section 121.0515, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

121.0515 Special risk membership; criteria; designation and removal of classification; credits for past service and prior service; retention of special risk normal retirement date. --

- (2) CRITERIA. -- A member, to be designated as a special risk member, must meet the following criteria:
- (a) The member must be employed as a law enforcement officer and be certified, or required to be certified, in compliance with s. 943.1395; however, sheriffs and elected police chiefs shall be excluded from meeting the certification requirements of this paragraph. In addition, the member's duties and responsibilities must include the pursuit, apprehension, and arrest of law violators or suspected law violators; or the member must be an active member of a bomb disposal unit whose primary responsibility is the location, handling, and disposal of explosive devices; or the member 31 | must be the supervisor or command officer of a member or

 members who have such responsibilities; provided, however, administrative support personnel, including, but not limited to, those whose primary duties and responsibilities are in accounting, purchasing, legal, and personnel, shall not be included;

- (b) The member must be employed as a firefighter and be certified, or required to be certified, in compliance with s. 633.35 and be employed solely within the fire department of the employer or agency of state government. In addition, the member's duties and responsibilities must include on-the-scene fighting of fires or direct supervision of firefighting units, or the member must be the supervisor or command officer of a member or members who have such responsibilities; provided, however, administrative support personnel, including, but not limited to, those whose primary duties and responsibilities are in accounting, purchasing, legal, and personnel, shall not be included;
- officer and be certified, or required to be certified, in compliance with s. 943.1395. In addition, the member's primary duties and responsibilities must be the custody, and physical restraint when necessary, of prisoners or inmates within a prison, jail, or other criminal detention facility, or while on work detail outside the facility, or while being transported; or the member must be the supervisor or command officer of a member or members who have such responsibilities; provided, however, administrative support personnel, including, but not limited to, those whose primary duties and responsibilities are in accounting, purchasing, legal, and personnel, shall not be included; however, superintendents and

- Life Support (ALS) or Basic Life Support (BLS) employer as an emergency medical technician or a paramedic and be certified in compliance with s. 401.27. In addition, the member's primary duties and responsibilities must include on-the-scene emergency medical care or direct supervision of emergency medical technicians and paramedics, or the member must be the supervisor or command officer of one or more members who have such responsibilities. However, administrative support personnel, including, but not limited to, those whose primary responsibilities are in accounting, purchasing, legal, and personnel, shall not be included; or-
- (e) The member must be employed as a Federal Aviation Administration-licensed helicopter pilot by a municipal, county, or state agency authorized to provide law enforcement, fire protection, or emergency medical services. In addition, the member's duties must include piloting the aircraft for the purpose of rescue, surveillance, or pursuit or the movement of personnel of any such agency. However, administrative support personnel, including, but not limited to, those whose primary responsibilities are in accounting, purchasing, legal, and personnel, shall not be included.

Section 2. The Legislature finds that a proper and legitimate state purpose is served when employees and retirees of the state and of its political subdivisions and the dependents, survivors, and beneficiaries of such employees and retirees, are extended the basic protections afforded by governmental retirement systems that are managed, administered, and funded in an actuarially sound manner, as

required by s. 14, Article X of the State Constitution and part VII of chapter 112, Florida Statutes. Therefore, the Legislature hereby determines and declares that the provisions of this act fulfill an important state interest. Section 3. This act shall take effect October 1, 2000. SENATE SUMMARY Extends membership in the special risk class of the Florida Retirement System to helicopter pilots employed by governmental law enforcement, firefighting, or emergency medical agencies and to persons who supervise emergency medical technicians or paramedics or who supervise the persons who supervise the emergency medical technicians or paramedics.
