A misdemeanor of the second degree is reclassified 20 to a misdemeanor of the first degree. 21 2. A misdemeanor of the first degree is reclassified 22 to a felony of the third degree. 3. A felony of the third degree is reclassified to a 23 24 felony of the second degree. 25 4. A felony of the second degree is reclassified to a felony of the first degree. 26 27 5. incapacitation due to a developmental disability, organic brain damage, or mental illness, and has one or more physical or mental limitations that restrict the victim's ability to perform the normal activities of daily living. 2. "Advanced age" means that the victim is older than б 65 years of age. Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2000. SENATE SUMMARY Provides that a crime based upon the gender of the victim is a hate crime and results in an enhanced penalty.
