Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida: Section 1. Section 2 of chapter 67-930, Laws of Florida, as amended by chapters 83-363, 93-286, and 94-344, Laws of Florida, is amended to read: Section 2. The tax authorized by section 1 shall not exceed two percent (2%) of the rent received by the person renting such room or rooms from the person paying said rent, and of the retail sales price paid by any guest, consumer or any person on the purchase of each sale of food or, beverages, and of each sale of alcoholic beverages for consumption on the premises, at any place of business required by law to be licensed by the state hotel and restaurant commission or by the state beverage department. SENATE SUMMARY Authorizes an increase in the maximum rate of resort tax from 4 percent to 6 percent, but the tax may not be imposed at a rate greater than 4 percent unless the higher rate is approved by a majority plus one of the governing body of the governmental entity seeking to increase the tax and by referendum of the electors of that governmental entity.
