WHEREAS, it is estimated that the State of Florida had 1 2 248,000 residents who served in the Armed Forces during World War II, and, of those, 3,174 paid the ultimate sacrifice, 3 giving their lives defending freedom, and 4 5 WHEREAS, today almost 600,000 World War II veterans 6 proudly call Florida home, and 7 WHEREAS, it is fitting, proper, and an honor for the 8 State of Florida to contribute its portion to the National 9 World War II Memorial as a way of honoring our World War II 10 veterans and our citizens who supported the war effort from 11 home, NOW, THEREFORE, 12 13 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida: 14 15 Section 1.
