2. At the end of each semester, the parent or guardian
of each student in grades 9, 10, 11, and 12 who has a
cumulative grade point average of less than 0.5 above the
cumulative grade point average required for graduation shall
be notified that the student is at risk of not meeting the
requirements for graduation. The notice shall contain an
explanation of the policies the district has in place to
assist the student in meeting the grade point average
requirement.
3. Special assistance to obtain a high school
equivalency diploma pursuant to s. 229.814 may be given only

when the student has completed all requirements for graduation

except the attainment of the required cumulative grade point

average.

The standards required in this subsection, and any subsequent modifications, shall be reprinted in the Florida

Administrative Code even though not defined as "rules."

Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2000.
