A bill to be entitled

An act relating to courses of study; amending s. 233.061, F.S., relating to required instruction; providing for the inclusion of certain historic documents in required public school instruction; requiring certain instruction to be provided in at least two grade levels in both elementary school and high school; requiring the State Board of Education to adopt rules; providing an effective date.

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

Section 1. Subsection (2) of section 233.061, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

233.061 Required instruction.--

- (2) Members of the instructional staff of the public schools, subject to the rules and regulations of the commissioner, the state board, and the school board, shall teach efficiently and faithfully, using the books and materials required, following the prescribed courses of study, and employing approved methods of instruction, the following:
- (a) The content of the Declaration of Independence and how it forms the philosophical foundation of our government.
- (b) The arguments in support of adopting our republican form of government, as they are embodied in the most important of the Federalist Papers.
- (c) The $\underline{\text{history and}}$ essentials of the United States Constitution and how it provides the structure of our government.

- (d) The content and significance of Abraham Lincoln's Gettysburg Address, the Emancipation Proclamation, and George Washington's Farewell Address.
- (e) The content and history of the Constitution of the State of Florida.
- $\underline{\text{(f)}}$ Flag education, including proper flag display and flag salute.
- $\underline{(g)}$ (e) The elements of civil government shall include the primary functions of and interrelationships between the Federal Government, the state, and its counties, municipalities, school districts, and special districts.
- (h)(f) The history of the Holocaust (1933-1945), the systematic, planned annihilation of European Jews and other groups by Nazi Germany, a watershed event in the history of humanity, to be taught in a manner that leads to an investigation of human behavior, an understanding of the ramifications of prejudice, racism, and stereotyping, and an examination of what it means to be a responsible and respectful person, for the purposes of encouraging tolerance of diversity in a pluralistic society and for nurturing and protecting democratic values and institutions.
- $\underline{\text{(i)}(g)}$ The history of African Americans, including the history of African peoples before the political conflicts that led to the development of slavery, the passage to America, the enslavement experience, abolition, and the contributions of African Americans to society.
 - (j) (h) The elementary principles of agriculture.
- $\underline{(k)}$ (i) The true effects of all alcoholic and intoxicating liquors and beverages and narcotics upon the human body and mind.
 - (1) (j) Kindness to animals.

1 (m) (m) the history of the state. 2 (n) The conservation of natural resources. 3 (o) (m) Comprehensive health education that addresses 4 concepts of community health; consumer health; environmental 5 health; family life, including an awareness of the benefits of sexual abstinence as the expected standard and the 6 7 consequences of teenage pregnancy; mental and emotional 8 health; injury prevention and safety; nutrition; personal health; prevention and control of disease; and substance use 10 and abuse. 11 (p)(n) Such additional materials, subjects, courses, 12 or fields in such grades as are prescribed by law or by rules 13 of the commissioner and the school board in fulfilling the 14 requirements of law. 15 (q)(o) The study of Hispanic contributions to the 16 United States. 17 (r) (p) The study of women's contributions to the 18 United States. 19 (s) (q) A character-development program in the 20 elementary schools, similar to Character First or Character 21 Counts. Such a program must be secular in nature and must 22 stress such character qualities as attentiveness, patience, and initiative. 23 24 Instruction in the courses of study required by paragraphs (a) 25 26 through (g) of this subsection must be provided in at least 27 two grade levels during elementary school and two grade levels 28 during high school. The State Board of Education shall adopt rules pursuant to ss. 120.536(1) and 120.54 to implement this 29

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provision.
