Senator Mitchell moved the following amendment:

Senate Amendment (with title amendment)

On page 165, between lines 12 and 13,

insert:

Section 102. The Florida Building Commission shall examine the applicability of the full proposed Florida Building Code to buildings manufactured and assembled offsite but not intended for human habitation, such as storage sheds and lawn storage buildings. The commission shall consider whether such buildings should be subject to the same standards applicable to buildings intended for human habitation; the feasibility of constructing such buildings to such standards; the additional financial costs associated with compliance with such standards; the risk reduction effects associated with such compliance; and the long-term economic and practical consequences attendant to such compliance. The commission shall report its findings and recommendations for legislative change, if any, to the President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives by January 1, 2001.
