Section 3. Sections 506.29, 506.30, 506.31, 506.32, 21 22 506.33, 506.34, 506.35, 506.36, 506.37, 506.38, 506.39, 506.40, 506.41, 506.42, 506.43, 506.44, and 506.45, Florida 23 24 Statutes, are repealed. 25 Section 4. This paragraph does not grant 27 additional authority to regulate these discharges. 28 (b) This section does not limit federally delegated 29 regulatory authority. 30 (c) The Department of Environmental Protection may 31 adopt rules to establish criteria for dairy farms which 3

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provide reasonable assurance that state nitrate groundwater 1 2 quality standards will not be violated and which, provided 3 such criteria are met, shall prohibit the Department of Environmental Protection from instituting proceedings against 4 5 any dairy farmer under the provisions of s. 376.307(5) and shall provide a presumption of compliance with safe nitrate 6 7 groundwater quality standards. 8 (d) This section, except for subsection (2), does not apply to the manufacture, mixing, or blending of fertilizer, 9 10 including fertilizer containing sludge, residuals, or septage. 11 (8)(9) EXPIRATION OF PROVISIONS. -- Subsections (1), 12 (2), (3), (4), and (6), and (7) expire on December 31, 2003. 13 Subsections (5) and (7) (8) expire on December 31, 2008. 14 Section 9. Sections 588.07 and 588.08, Florida 15 Statutes, are repealed. 16 Section 10. Paragraph (b) of subsection (3) of section 17 593.114, Florida Statutes, is repealed. Section 11. Paragraph (e) of subsection (2) of section 18 597.004, Florida Statutes, is repealed. 19 20 Section 12.
