B. PRESENT SITUATION:

The Committee on Business Development & International Trade was asked to review a number of sections of the Florida Statutes to determine if those sections have become obsolete, have had their effect, have served their purpose, or have been impliedly repealed or superseded. The committee identified a number of such sections and referred that information to the House Committee on Rules and Calendar, which resulted in the drafting and passage of Proposed Committee Bill RC 00-019 by that committee.

That Proposed Committee Bill is now before the Committee on Business Development & International Trade as House Bill 4037.

Section 2 Repeals obsolete provisions relating to the Cape San Blas Spaceport property. The language addressed environmental concerns. Since that time, the concrete launch pad was washed away by a hurricane. Spaceport Florida has no plans to develop the facility. [s. 331.307, F.S.]

Section 3 Repeals a dated report requirement. [s. 414.030(9)(b), F.S.]

Section 4 Repeals a provision relating to exemption from leased real property requirements which expired June 30, 1999. [s. 414.25, F.S.]

Section 5 Repeals dated provision relating to automated fingerprint imaging. [s. 414.391, F.S.]

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- Section 6 Deletes a definition relating to voluntary unemployment compensation contributions repealed by previous law. [s. 443.036(43), F.S.]
- Section 7 Deletes a provision relating to voluntary unemployment compensation contributions repealed by previous law. [s. 443.131(3)(j), F.S.]
- Section 8 Deletes an expired provision relating to the effective date of unemployment compensation claims provisions. [s. 443.151(1)(b)5., F.S.]
- Section 9 Deletes Job Training Partnership Act provisions which stand repealed on June 30, 2000. [s. 446.205, F.S.]
- Section 10 Repeals outdated provisions relating to assistance to displaced local exchange telecommunications company workers. [s. 446.60, F.S.]
- Section 11 Deletes Workforce Florida Act of 1996 language which stands repealed on June 30, 2000. [s. 446.605, F.S.]
- Section 12 Deletes Workforce Florida Act of 1996 language which stands repealed on June 30, 2000. [s. 446.606, F.S.]
- Section 13 Effective date - Effective upon becoming a law.

On February 21, 2000, the Committee on Business Development & International Trade adopted two amendments. The first amendment deleted from the bill provisions which are also contained in reviser's bills, House Bills 1061 and 1063. The second amendment deleted from the bill a section repealing the authorization for a pilot project implementing the use of automated fingerprint imaging as part of the electronic benefits transfer program under the WAGES act.
