Section 258.16, Florida Statutes, is 18 created to read: 19 258.16 Rodman Reservoir Recreation Area and Reserve 20 designated. --(1) There is designated and established a state 21 22 recreation area to be known as Rodman Reservoir Recreation Area and Reserve, in Marion and Putman Counties, which shall 23 24 include all state-owned lands within the floodplain of the 25 Oklawaha River and those hereafter acquired by the state from Eureka Dam in Marion County to Buckman Lock in Putnam County. 26 Such lands shall be deemed and held to be a state recreation 27 28 area, under the supervision of the Division of Recreation and 29 Parks of the Department of Environmental Protection, and the 30 division is charged with the duty of providing for the 31 development of multipurpose recreational opportunities at this 1

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recreation area and the care, upkeep, maintenance, and 1 2 beautification of the Rodman Reservoir Recreation Area and 3 Reserve, including all those dams, locks, and other structures 4 transferred by the Federal Government to the state. Such structures may be permanently closed and filled with suitable 5 materials if their continued maintenance and operation is б 7 determined by the department not to be cost-effective due to 8 the overall condition of the structures when they were transferred by the Federal Government. The department shall 9 10 not adopt any rules or regulations, nor utilize any existing rules or regulations, prohibiting recreational opportunities, 11 12 including, but not limited to hunting and fishing, in the 13 Rodman Reservoir Recreational Area and Reserve. Any proposed action that would substantially alter the recreation area as 14 15 it existed on January 1, 2000, shall be approved by the Legislature prior to implementation. 16 17 (2) The Division of State Lands may acquire in the name of the Board of Trustees of the Internal Improvement 18 Trust Fund any additional property adjacent or contiguous to 19 the Rodman Reservoir Recreation Area and Reserve, from private 20 owners or from the United States Government, for improved 21 22 management and recreational opportunities. The Division of State Lands is directed to 23 (3) 24 identify, contact, and inform all property owners who entered 25 into easements located within the taking line of the Rodman Reservoir of the designation of this area as a state 26 27 recreation area.
