Section 627.6409, Florida Statutes, is 11 amended to read: 12 627.6409 Coverage for osteoporosis screening, 13 diagnosis, treatment, and management. -- Any health insurance policy that covers a resident of this state and that is 14 issued, amended, delivered, or renewed in this state after 15 October 1, 1996, must provide coverage for the medically 16 necessary diagnosis and treatment of osteoporosis for 17 high-risk individuals, including, but not limited to, 18 19 estrogen-deficient individuals who are at clinical risk for 20 osteoporosis, individuals who have vertebral abnormalities, 21 individuals who are receiving long-term glucocorticoid 22 (steroid) therapy, individuals who have primary hyperparathyroidism, and individuals who have a family history 23 of osteoporosis. Such coverage must include bone-mass-density 24 25 tests considered medically necessary for diagnosis or treatment of osteoporosis for high-risk individuals.
