Section 465.0075, Florida Statutes, is 16 created to read: 17 465.0075 Licensure by endorsement; requirements; 18 fee.--The department shall issue a license by 19 (1)20 endorsement to any applicant who applies to the department and remits a nonrefundable fee of not more than \$100, as set by 21 the board, and who the board certifies: 22 Has met the qualifications for licensure in s. 23 (a) 24 465.007(1)(b)-(c); (b) Has obtained a passing score, as established by 25 26 rule of the board, on the licensure examination of the National Association of Boards of Pharmacy (NABPLEX) or a 27 28 similar national organization, if the board certifies that the 29 applicant has taken the required examination not more than 15 years prior to application; 30 31

c)1. Has submitted evidence of the active licensed practice of pharmacy in another jurisdiction for at least 2 years of the immediately preceding 5 years or evidence of successful completion of board-approved postgraduate training or a board-approved clinical competency examination within the year immediately preceding application for licensure. For purposes of this paragraph, "active licensed practice of pharmacy" means the practice of pharmacy by pharmacists, including those employed by any governmental entity in community or public health, as defined by this chapter; or

- 2. Has completed an internship meeting the requirements of s. 465.007(1)(c) within the 2 years immediately preceding application; and
- (d) Has obtained a passing score on the pharmacy jurisprudence portions of the licensure examination, as required by board rule.
- (2) The department may not issue a license by endorsement to any applicant who is under investigation in any jurisdiction for an act or offense that would constitute a violation of this chapter until the investigation is complete, at which time the provisions of s. 465.016 apply.
- (3) The department may not issue a license by endorsement to any applicant whose license to practice pharmacy has been suspended or revoked in another state or to any applicant who is currently the subject of any disciplinary proceeding in another state.
