(a) and (b), the Department of Transportation will include safety zones by installing School Speed Limit Zones along highways contiguous to school property. (2) Upon request from the appropriate local government, the Department of Transportation shall install and maintain such traffic and pedestrian control devices on state-maintained roads as prescribed in this section for all prekindergarten early-intervention schools that receive federal funding through the Headstart program, public and private elementary schools, middle schools, alternative learning centers, and high schools. Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2000. HOUSE SUMMARY Directs the Department of Transportation to provide safety zones by installing School Speed Limit Zones along highways contiguous to school property.
