I. Summary:

The bill re-creates the Florida Endowment for Vocational Rehabilitation Fund Trust Fund without modification, effective November 4, 2000. The Florida Endowment for Vocational Rehabilitation Fund Trust Fund is administered by the State Board of Administration. This fund was last re-created effective November 4, 1996, by Chapter 96-143.

The bill amends Chapter 96-143, Laws of Florida, and re-creates the trust fund pursuant to section 413.615, Florida Statutes.

The program is designed to encourage public and private support for enhancement of vocational rehabilitation and employment of disabled citizens. The trust funds are used to support this initiative.
