I. Summary:

The committee substitute terminates the Direct Assistance Trust Fund within the Department of Children and Family Services (DCF) and the Administrative Trust Fund within the Department of Veterans' Affairs.

The bill also renames the Child Care and Development Block Grant Trust Fund within the DCF, the Child Care and Development Trust Fund.

This bill will take effect July 1, 2000.

This bill amends Chapter 96-103, Laws of Florida.

II. Present Situation:

The Direct Assistance Trust Fund within the Department of Health and Rehabilitative Services was recreated pursuant to Chapter 96-110, Laws of Florida. The fund provides cash assistance payments and a reserve for Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF) participants.

The Administrative Trust Fund within the Department of Veterans' Affairs was recreated pursuant to Chapter 96-127, Laws of Florida and was never funded.

The Child Care and Development Block Grant Trust Fund within the DCF was recreated pursuant to Chapter 96-103, Laws of Florida. The fund provides subsidized child care assistance payments.

III. Effect of Proposed Changes:

Section 1. The committee substitute terminates the Direct Assistance Trust Fund within the Department of Children and Family Services (DCF) and the Administrative Trust Fund within the Department of Veterans' Affairs.

Section 2. Chapter 96-103, Laws of Florida is amended and renames the Child Care and Development Block Grant Trust Fund within the DCF, the Child Care and Development Trust Fund.

Section 3. This bill will take effect July 1, 2000.
