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- (4) State funds collected pursuant to s. 561.501 shall be paid into the State Treasury and credited to the following accounts:
- (a) <u>Twenty-seven and two-tenths</u> Thirteen and six-tenths percent of the surcharge on the sale of alcoholic beverages for consumption on premises shall be transferred to the Children and Adolescents Substance Abuse Trust Fund, which shall remain with the Department of Children and Family Services for the purpose of funding programs directed at reducing and eliminating substance abuse problems among children and adolescents.

shall be deposited in the State Treasury to the credit of the

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HOUSE SUMMARY

Reduces the surcharges on liquor, wine, cider, and beer sold for consumption on the premises by one-half, and increases the portion of such surcharge that is transferred to the Children and Adolescents Substance Abuse Trust Fund, for a 1-year period. Repeals said surcharges effective September 1, 2001.
