SECTION 4. Disqualifications. --17 (a) No person convicted of a felony, or adjudicated in 18 19 this or any other state to be mentally incompetent, shall be 20 qualified to vote or hold office until restoration of civil 21 rights or removal of disability. No person convicted of a 22 felony shall be qualified to vote until the person's right to 23 register or vote has been restored, as provided by law. No person adjudicated in this state to be mentally incompetent 24 shall be qualified to vote until removal of disability. 25 26 (b) No person may appear on the ballot for re-election 27 to any of the following offices: 28 (1) Florida representative, 29 (2) Florida senator, 30 (3) Florida Lieutenant governor,
