A resolution honoring centenarian George Clayton Bush.

WHEREAS, in 1949, Clayton Bush took a job as a school bus driver and for the next 15 years drove a route which included Old Town Elementary School, and to this day still remembers the names of many of the students who rode with him, and

WHEREAS, possessed of extremely good health, both physically and mentally, George Clayton Bush greeted the dawn of January 1, 2000, as one of the very few with the distinction of having lived during the 1800's, 1900's, and 2000's, NOW, THEREFORE,
