deadlines for applications for adjustment of resident status for Haitian and other nationals. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the President of the United States is urged to issue a protective order preventing Haitian nationals who are eligible for legal resident status under б Senate Bill 2058 from being deported while Senate Bill 2058 is pending in the 106th Congress. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that copies of this resolution be sent to the President of the United States, the President of the United States Senate, the Speaker of the United States House of Representatives, and to each member of the Florida delegation to the United States Congress.
