25 Section 1. Section 16.55, Florida Statutes, is
26 repealed.

27
28 Reviser's note.--Repeals a provision requiring

30 prevention training materials for localities no
31 later than July 1988.

1 Section 2. Paragraph (g) of subsection (2) of section
2 16.58, Florida Statutes, is repealed.

3
4 Reviser's note.--Repeals a provision requiring
5 development of a pilot project of staff or
6 contract court reporters to provide court
7 reporting services to state agencies and
8 requiring recommendations for the pilot program
9 by January 1, 1994.

11 Section 3. Subsection (5) of section 16.60, Florida
12 Statutes, is repealed.

13
14 Reviser's note.--Repeals a provision requiring

1 Section 9. Subsection (3) of section 27.709, Florida
2 Statutes, is repealed.

4 Reviser's note.--Repeals a provision requiring
5 a study to evaluate whether the elimination of
6 state postconviction proceedings in death
7 penalty cases delays carrying out of sentences
8 and requires a report of study results by
9 December 1, 1998.

11 Section 10. Subsection (2) of section 39.3065, Florida
12 Statutes, is repealed.

13
14 Reviser's note.--Repeals a provision relating
15 to contracting for and funding of child

26

2 of a notary is for 4 years.

4 Section 15. Paragraph (g) of subsection (2) of section
5 120.574, Florida Statutes, is repealed.

6
7 Reviser's note.--Repeals a provision requiring
8 maintenance of a register of the total number
9 of formal proceedings filed with the Division
10 of Administrative Hearings for a period of 2
11 years following October 1, 1996.

12
13 Section 16. Section 142.18, Florida Statutes, is
14 repealed.

15
16 Reviser's note.--Repeals a provision requiring
17 county commissioners to adopt forms furnished
18 in accordance with s. 142.17, which was
19 repealed by s. 11, ch. 99-259, Laws of Florida.
20 There is no existing statutory provision
21 relating to the subject matter formerly covered
22 in s. 142.17.

23
24 Section 17. Subsection (2) of section 159.345,
25 subsection (2) of section 159.475, and subsection (2) of
26 section 159.7055, Florida Statutes, are repealed.

27
28 Reviser's note.--Repeals provisions requiring
29 the Division of Bond Finance to provide copies
30 of specified reports to the Division of
31 Economic Development of the Department of

1 Commerce. Section 20.17, which created the
2 Department of Commerce, was repealed by s. 3,
3 ch. 96-320, Laws of Florida.

5 Section 18. Subsection (2) of section 161.56, Florida
6 Statutes, is repealed.

7
8 Reviser's note.--Repeals a provision requiring

23 and allows for local governments to choose the
24 evaluation method for their reports if the
25 adoption date is after September 30, 1998, and
26 before February 2, 1999.

28 Section 22. Subparagraph 4. of paragraph (d) of
29 subsection (9) of section 166.231, Florida Statutes, is
30 repealed.

1 Reviser's note.--Repeals a provision

3 any shortfall in the municipal utility tax
