**Senate Amendment (with title amendment)**

On page 3, before line 1,

insert:

Section 2. Section 286.31, Florida Statutes, is created to read:

286.31.--Authority of local governments in connection with federal minimum wage.--No county, municipality, or any other political subdivision of the state may, whether by ordinance, resolution, referendum, initiative, contract or procurement, or as a requirement of a license or permit, or by any other means, require a private employer to pay any employee a minimum wage higher than that required by federal law. If it is determined by an officer or agency responsible for distributing federal funds to the county, municipality, or any political subdivision that compliance with this subsection will cause denial of these federal funds or would otherwise be inconsistent with the federal requirements pertaining to such funds, this section shall not apply, but only to the extent
