"Drag race" is defined as the operation of two or 18 (2) 19 more vehicles from a point side by side at accelerating speeds 20 in a competitive attempt to outdistance each other, or the 21 operation of one or more vehicles over a common selected 22 course, from the same point to the same point, for the purpose of comparing the relative speeds or power of acceleration of 23 24 such vehicle or vehicles within a certain distance or time limit. 25 (3) "Racing" is defined as the use of one or more 26 vehicles in an attempt to outgain, outdistance, or prevent 27 28 another vehicle from passing, to arrive at a given destination 29 ahead of another vehicle or vehicles, or to test the physical stamina or endurance of drivers over long-distance driving 30 31 routes.
