Present subsections (20) through (44) of section 320.01, Florida Statutes, are renumbered as 20 21 subsections (21) through (45), respectively, and a new 22 subsection (20) is added to that section to read: 320.01 Definitions, general. -- As used in the Florida 23 Statutes, except as otherwise provided, the term: 24 25 (20) "Extended registration period means a period of 24 months during which a motor vehicle or mobile home 26 27 registration is valid. 28 Section 2. Present subsections (2) through (7) of section 320.055, Florida Statutes, are renumbered as 29 30 subsections (3) through (8), respectively, and a new 31 subsection (2) is added to that section, to read:

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320.055 Registration periods; renewal periods.--The following registration periods and renewal periods are established:

(2) Any motor vehicle that is subject to registration under s.320.08(1), (2), or (3) and is owned by a natural person is eligible for an extended registration period, which begins the first day of the birth month of the owner and ends the last day of the month immediately preceding the owner's birth month 24 months after the beginning of the registration period. If the vehicle is registered in the name of more than one person, the birth month of the person whose name first appears on the registration shall be used to determine the extended registration period. For a vehicle subject to this extended registration period, the renewal period is the 30-day period ending at midnight on the vehicle owner's date of birth.

Section 3. Paragraphs (b) and (c) of subsection (1) of section 320.06, Florida Statutes, are amended to read:

320.06 Registration certificates, license plates, and validation stickers generally .--

(1)

Registration license plates bearing a graphic symbol and the alphanumeric system of identification shall be issued for a 5-year period. At the end of said 5-year period, upon renewal, the plate shall be replaced. The fee for such replacement shall be \$10, \$2 of which shall be paid each year before the plate is replaced, to be credited towards the next \$10 replacement fee. The fees shall be deposited into the Highway Safety Operating Trust Fund. A credit or refund shall not be given for any prior years' payments of such prorated 31 replacement fee when the plate is replaced or surrendered

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before the end of the 5-year period. With each license plate, there shall be issued a validation sticker showing the owner's birth month or the appropriate renewal period if the owner is not a natural person. This validation sticker shall be placed on the upper left corner of the license plate and shall be issued one time during the life of the license plate, or upon request when it has been damaged or destroyed. There shall also be issued with each license plate a serially numbered validation sticker showing the year of expiration, which sticker shall be placed on the upper right corner of the license plate. Such license plate and validation stickers shall be issued based on the applicant's appropriate renewal period. The registration period shall be a period of 12 months, and the extended registration period shall be a period or 24 months, and all expirations shall occur based on the applicant's appropriate registration or extended registration period. A vehicle with an apportioned registration shall be issued an annual license plate and a cab card that denote the declared gross vehicle weight for each apportioned jurisdiction in which the vehicle is authorized to operate.

(c) Registration license plates equipped with validation stickers subject to the registration period shall be valid for not more than 12 months and shall expire at midnight on the last day of the registration period. Registration license plates equipped with validation stickers subject to the extended registration period shall be valid for not more than 24 months and shall expire on midnight of the last day of the extended registration period. For each registration period after the one in which the metal registration license plate is issued, and until the license plate is required to be replaced, a validation sticker showing 31

the year of expiration shall be issued upon payment of the 2 proper license tax amount and fees and shall be valid for not 3 more than 12 months. For each extended registration period 4 occurring after the one in which the metal registration 5 license plate is issued, and until the license plate is 6 required to be replaced, a validation sticker showing the year 7 of expiration shall be issued upon payment of the proper 8 license tax amount and fees and shall be valid for not more 9 than 24 months. When license plates equipped with validation 10 stickers are issued in any month other than the owner's birth 11 month or the designated registration period for any other motor vehicle, the effective date shall reflect the birth 12 month or month and the year of renewal. However, when a 13 license plate or validation sticker is issued for a period of 14 15 less than 12 months, the applicant shall pay the appropriate amount of license tax and the applicable fee under the 16 17 provisions of s. 320.14 in addition to all other fees. Validation stickers issued for vehicles taxed under the 18 19 provisions of s. 320.08(6)(a), for any company which owns 250 20 vehicles or more, or for semitrailers taxed under the provisions of s. 320.08(5)(a), for any company which owns 50 21 vehicles or more, may be placed on any vehicle in the fleet so 22 long as the vehicle receiving the validation sticker has the 23 24 same owner's name and address as the vehicle to which the 25 validation sticker was originally assigned. Section 4. Subsection (1) of 320.07, Florida Statutes, 26 is amended, present subsections (3) through (5) of that 27 28 section are renumbered as subsections (4) through (6), 29 respectively, and a new subsection (3) is added to that section to read: 30

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320.07 Expiration of registration; annual renewal required; penalties.--

- (1) The registration of a motor vehicle or mobile home shall expire at midnight on the last day of the registration or extended registration period. A vehicle shall not be operated on the roads of this state after expiration of the renewal period unless the registration has been renewed according to law.
- (3) Any person who owns a motor vehicle registered under s. 320.08(1), (2), or (3) may alternatively renew its registration biennially during the applicable renewal period, upon payment of the cumulative of all applicable license tax amounts required by s. 320.08, service charges required by s.320.04, and any additional fees required by law for the 24-month extended registration period.

Section 5. Subsection (1) of section 322.56, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

322.56 Contracts for administration of driver's license examination.--

(1) The department may, by contract, interagency agreement, or interlocal agreement, authorize a person, an entity of the state government, a subdivision of state government, a public or private corporation, a firm, an organization, a school, or an entity of a local government to administer the written and driving skills portions of an examination for all classes and types of driver's licenses, to issue all classes and types of driver's licenses and identification cards, to reinstate driver's licenses as provided elsewhere in this chapter, and to accept organ donor registrations, voter registrations and special fund contributions. If provided by the contract, the contractor

shall provide all services administered by the department relating to chapters 97, 316, 318, 322, 324, 488, and 627. The 2 3 services to be provided may include, but are not limited to, the following, if required by the contract: 4 5 (a) Licensing and identification-card services, which includes establishing the customer's identity, eligible 6 7 driving status, age, driver education requirements, secondary 8 school enrollment/completion requirements, vehicle registration requirements, and physical and mental fitness; 9 10 (b) Examining the customer's knowledge of traffic laws 11 and safe operating practices specific to various classes of licenses and endorsements; 12 (c) Examining the customer's actual physical abilities 13 to operate specific motor vehicles safely; 14 Solicitation for participation in the state 15 authorized organ donation program, contribution to the state 16 election fund, organ donor fund, and prevent blindness fund; 17 18 Soliciting participation in voter registration 19 services as required by the "Motor-Voter" portion of the National Voting Rights Act of 1993 and chapter 97; 20 21 (f) Reinstating sanctions authorized by this chapter; 22 (g) Accepting surrender of Florida vehicle registrations in compliance with chapter 627; 23 24 (h) Issuing receipts to law enforcement members and 25 recovery agents to document the surrender of seized tags under 26 chapter 324; 27 (i) Participating in the prevention and detection of fraudulent driver license and identification-card applications 28 29 and all related enforcement actions; 30

1	(j) Issuing Florida driver's licenses, temporary
2	permits, identification cards, and state-employee
3	identification cards for state agencies;
4	(k) Recordkeeping and preparing activity reports as
5	required by the state. Motor vehicle records must be
6	maintained in accordance with the public records provisions of
7	chapter 119.
8	Section 6. This act shall take effect October 1, 2001.
