If the physician determines that a 20 participant is physically or mentally unfit to proceed, the 21 physician shall notify any commissioner or the commission 22 representative who shall immediately cancel the match. 23 The 24 examination shall conform to rules adopted by the commission 25 based on the advice of the medical advisory council. 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which demonstrate whether the participant is free from any 1 2 communicable disease. If required by the commission and the 3 blood test results are not presented as required by commission 4 rule or reveal the participant has a communicable disease, the 5 commission representative shall immediately cancel the match.
