A bill to be entitled 1 An act relating to trust funds; creating the 2 3 Digital Divide Trust Fund in the State Technology Office; providing for sources of 4 moneys and purposes; providing for 5 administration of the fund; providing for 6 7 future review and termination or re-creation of 8 the trust fund; providing a contingent 9 effective date. 10 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida: 11 12 Section 1. (1) The Digital Divide Trust Fund is 13 14 created in the State Technology Office for the purpose of receiving and disbursing funds required to pay part or all of 15 the costs of facilitating design and implementation of one or 16 17 more programs using information technology to educate and train members of economically disadvantaged families to become 18 19 qualified to compete effectively for high-skill, high-wage 20 employment opportunities in the information technology industry in this state. The trust fund shall be administered 21 2.2 by the Digital Divide Council in the State Technology Office. 23 (2) There is hereby transferred \$3 million of 24 Temporary Assistance to Needy Families funds in the Employment 25 Security Administration Trust Fund within the Agency for Workforce Innovation to the Digital Divide Trust Fund. The 26 Digital Divide Trust Fund may also receive additional funding 27 lawfully made from other sources, including, but not limited 28 29 to, other and further appropriations from the state and gifts,

donations, and matching contributions from other public

agencies and private persons and entities.

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Section 2. (1) Pursuant to the provisions of Section 19(f)(2), Article III of the State Constitution, the Digital Divide Trust Fund shall, unless terminated sooner, be terminated July 1, 2005.

(2) Prior to the regular legislative session immediately preceding the date on which the trust fund is scheduled to be terminated, the State Technology Office and the Governor shall recommend to the President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives whether the trust fund should be allowed to terminate or should be re-created. These recommendations shall be based on a review of the purpose and use of the trust fund and a determination of whether the trust fund will continue to be necessary. A recommendation to re-create the trust fund may include suggested modifications to the purposes, sources of receipts, and allowable expenditures for the trust fund. The State Technology Office's recommendation shall be made as a part of its legislative budget request to the Legislature pursuant to section 216.023, Florida Statutes. The Governor's recommendation shall be made as a part of the recommended budget presented to the Legislature pursuant to section 216.162, Florida Statutes.

(3) If the trust fund is terminated, the State

Technology Office shall pay any outstanding debts or
obligations of the trust fund as soon as practicable and the

Comptroller shall close out and remove the trust fund from the
various state accounting systems, using generally accepted
accounting practices concerning warrants outstanding, assets,
and liabilities.
