(3) In the case of battery, from a misdemeanor of the first degree to a felony of the third degree. (4) In the case of assault, from a misdemeanor of the second degree to a misdemeanor of the first degree. Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2001. б SENATE SUMMARY Reclassifies the penalty to the next degree of severity if a person commits an assault, battery, aggravated assault, or aggravated battery on a person who is officiating an interscholastic activity.
