A bill to be entitled 1 2 An act relating to the Voting System Technology 3 Task Force; creating a Voting System Technology Task Force; providing for membership, officers, 4 5 organization, per diem, and staffing; providing duties; providing for a report and termination 6 7 of the task force upon submission of the 8 report; providing an appropriation; providing an effective date. 9 10 11 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida: 12 13 Section 1. (1) The Voting System Technology Task 14 Force is created within the Department of State to study the 15 issues and costs of developing and implementing an Internet or 16 on-line voting system for use in this state. The task force 17 shall be composed of 21 members, as follows: (a) The Secretary of State, or the secretary's 18 19 designee, who shall serve as chair of the task force; 20 (b) One member of the Florida Senate appointed by the 21 President of the Senate; 22 (c) One member of the Florida House of Representatives appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives; 23 24 (d) One member of the Florida Senate appointed by the 25 minority leader of the Senate; 26 (e) One member of the Florida House of Representatives 27 appointed by the minority leader of the House of 28 Representatives; 29 (f) One person appointed by the Governor; 30 Two faculty members of the State University System

who are technical experts appointed by the Chancellor;

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- (h) Twelve persons appointed by the Secretary of State as follows: four supervisors of elections, two from urban counties and two from rural counties; two public or private technical experts; one member of the Florida State Conference of Branches of the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People, upon recommendation of the state conference president; one member of the League of United Latin American Citizens, upon recommendation of the state director; two other interested persons of diverse age, race, gender, economic, and other relevant demographic characteristics; and two other persons whom the Secretary of State deems qualified or who have expertise in the field of computers, the Internet, or associated technologies; and
- (i) The chair of the Information Service Technology Development Task Force, or the chair's designee.
- (2) Members of the task force shall serve without compensation, but are entitled to reimbursement for per diem and travel expenses pursuant to s. 112.061, Florida Statutes, while engaged in their official duties.
- on-line voting system that will allow voters to cast secure electronic ballots from sites not under the control of elections officials and a system that will allow voters to cast secure electronic ballots from sites under the control of elections officials. The study must address the following issues:
 - (a) Security and voter fraud and privacy issues;

1 (d) Cost estimates for developing and implementing 2 pilot projects; and (e) Estimated costs and savings to be realized in 3 4 continuing development, full implementation, maintenance, and 5 operation of the system over time. 6 (4) The Secretary of State shall submit to the 7 Governor, the President of the Senate, and the Speaker of the 8 House of Representatives, by July 1, 2002, a report presenting the task force's recommendation and findings concerning 9 whether the state should pursue the development and 10 implementation of a widespread Internet or on-line voting 11 12 system. If the task force recommends Internet or on-line 13 voting favorably, the report must recommend steps for 14 developing and implementing such a system. Upon submission of 15 the secretary's report, the task force is abolished. 16 (5) The Division of Elections of the Department of State shall provide support staff for the task force. The 17 State Technology Office of the Department of Management 18 19 Services and the State University System shall assist the task 20 force, upon request. (6) Effective July 1, 2001, the sum of \$200,000 is 21 22 appropriated from the General Revenue Fund to the Department 23 of State, and two positions are created within the department, 24 to implement this act. 25 Section 2. This act shall take effect upon becoming a 26 law. 27 28 29 30 31
