A bill to be entitled

An act relating to the City of Coral Springs; providing for the relief of Helene Rippe; providing for an appropriation to compensate her for personal injuries suffered due to the negligence of the city; providing an effective date.

WHEREAS, Helene Rippe was attending a Little League game at Mullins Park, a multi-recreational facility owned and operated by the City of Coral Springs, when she was struck squarely in the middle of her face with a hard-hit foul ball, was knocked unconscious, and suffered extensive injuries, which necessitated two surgeries and resulted in the loss of her job, and

WHEREAS, when Helene Rippe was struck, she was watching the game from a spot in front of the players' benches and behind a fence that is 4 feet high, although she had previously been watching from the bleachers, which are behind an 8-foot-high fence, and

WHEREAS, Helene Rippe sued the city, alleging negligence, and the jury concluded that the city should have anticipated spectator injury despite the obviousness of the danger, that the city had constructive knowledge of the existence of a dangerous condition and therefore had a duty to correct the condition, and that the city was 40 percent at fault for Mrs. Rippe's injuries, and

WHEREAS, a final judgment in the amount of \$130,000 was entered in favor of Helene Rippe, of which the city has paid \$100,000, the maximum amount allowable under section 768.28, Florida Statutes, and

WHEREAS, the amount remaining under the judgment is \$30,000, which may be paid only through the passage of a claim bill, NOW, THEREFORE, Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida: Section 1. The facts stated in the preamble to this act are found and declared to be true. Section 2. The City of Coral Springs is authorized and directed to appropriate from funds of the city not otherwise appropriated and to draw a warrant in the amount of \$30,000 payable to Helene Rippe as compensation for injuries and damages sustained. Section 3. This act shall take effect upon becoming a law.
