Paragraph (i) of subsection (3) of section 11 12 119.07, Florida Statutes, is amended to read: 119.07 Inspection, examination, and duplication of 13 14 records; exemptions. --15 (3)(i)1. The home addresses, telephone numbers, social 16 17 security numbers, and photographs of active or former law enforcement personnel, including nonsworn employees of law 18 19 enforcement agencies who are designated by the sheriff or 20 chief of police as being in positions in which there is 21 significant contact with criminal defendants or suspects 22 involved in criminal activities, correctional and correctional probation officers, personnel of the Department of Children 23 and Family Services whose duties include the investigation of 24 25 abuse, neglect, exploitation, fraud, theft, or other criminal 26 activities, personnel of the Department of Health whose duties 27 are to support the investigation of child abuse or neglect, 28 and personnel of the Department of Revenue or local governments whose responsibilities include revenue collection 29 30 and enforcement or child support enforcement; the home 31 addresses, telephone numbers, social security numbers, 1

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1 photographs, and places of employment of the spouses and 2 children of such personnel; and the names and locations of 3 schools and day care facilities attended by the children of 4 such personnel are exempt from the provisions of subsection 5 (1). The home addresses, telephone numbers, and photographs of б firefighters certified in compliance with s. 633.35; the home 7 addresses, telephone numbers, photographs, and places of 8 employment of the spouses and children of such firefighters; 9 and the names and locations of schools and day care facilities 10 attended by the children of such firefighters are exempt from 11 subsection (1). The home addresses and telephone numbers of justices of the Supreme Court, district court of appeal 12 judges, circuit court judges, and county court judges; the 13 14 home addresses, telephone numbers, and places of employment of the spouses and children of justices and judges; and the names 15 and locations of schools and day care facilities attended by 16 17 the children of justices and judges are exempt from the 18 provisions of subsection (1). The home addresses, telephone 19 numbers, social security numbers, and photographs of current or former state attorneys, assistant state attorneys, 20 statewide prosecutors, or assistant statewide prosecutors; the 21 22 home addresses, telephone numbers, social security numbers, photographs, and places of employment of the spouses and 23 24 children of current or former state attorneys, assistant state attorneys, statewide prosecutors, or assistant statewide 25 prosecutors; and the names and locations of schools and day 26 care facilities attended by the children of current or former 27 28 state attorneys, assistant state attorneys, statewide 29 prosecutors, or assistant statewide prosecutors are exempt from subsection (1) and s. 24(a), Art. I of the State 30 31 Constitution. The home addresses and home telephone numbers of

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1 county and municipal code inspectors and code enforcement 2 officers are confidential and exempt from the provisions of 3 subsection (1) and s. 24(a), Art. I of the State Constitution. 4 2. An agency that is the custodian of the personal 5 information specified in subparagraph 1. and that is not the б employer of the officer, employee, justice, judge, or other 7 person specified in subparagraph 1. shall maintain the 8 confidentiality of the personal information only if the 9 officer, employee, justice, judge, other person, or employing 10 agency of the designated employee submits a written request 11 for confidentiality to the custodial agency. The Legislature finds that it is a public 12 Section 2. necessity that the home addresses, telephone numbers, social 13 14 security numbers, and photographs of nonsworn employees of law enforcement agencies who are designated by the sheriff or 15 chief of police as being in positions in which there is 16 17 significant contact with criminal defendants or suspects involved in criminal activities be held confidential and 18 19 exempt from public records requirements in order to protect those employees from harassment and injury by persons who have 20 been investigated by the law enforcement agency. Furthermore, 21 the Legislature finds that it would be an invasion of privacy 22 for those records to be revealed to the public. 23 24 Section 3. This act shall take effect upon becoming a 25 law. 26 27 28 SENATE SUMMARY 29 Exempts from public records disclosure certain information concerning employees of law enforcement agencies.
