Section 373.536, Florida Statutes, is 17 18 amended to read: 373.536 District budget and hearing thereon .--19 20 (1)FISCAL YEAR.--The fiscal year of districts created under the provisions of this chapter shall extend from October 21 22 1 of one year through September 30 of the following year. (2) BUDGET SUBMITTAL. -- The budget officer of the 23 24 district shall, on or before July 15 of each year, submit for 25 consideration by the governing board of the district a 26 tentative budget for the district covering its proposed operations operation and funding requirements for the ensuing 27 28 fiscal year. 29 (3) BUDGET HEARINGS AND WORKSHOPS; NOTICE.--30 (a) Unless alternative notice requirements are 31 otherwise provided by law, notice of all budget hearings 1 04/25/01 06:45 pm File original & 9 copies hep0001 01221-0114-854149

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1 conducted by the governing board or district staff must be 2 published in a newspaper of general <u>paid</u> circulation in each 3 county in which the district lies not less than 5 days nor 4 more than 15 days before the hearing.

5 (b) Budget workshops conducted for the public and not 6 governed by s. 200.065 must be advertised in a newspaper of 7 general <u>paid</u> circulation in the community or area in which the 8 workshop will occur not less than 5 days nor more than 15 days 9 before the workshop.

10 (c) The tentative budget shall be adopted in accordance with the provisions of s. 200.065; however, if the 11 12 mailing of the notice of proposed property taxes is delayed 13 beyond September 3 in any county in which the district lies, the district shall advertise its intention to adopt a 14 15 tentative budget and millage rate, pursuant to s. 200.065(3)(g), in a newspaper of general paid circulation in 16 17 that county. The budget shall set forth, classified by object 18 and purpose, and by fund if so designated, the proposed 19 expenditures of the district for bonds or other debt, for 20 construction, for acquisition of land, for operation and maintenance of the district works, for the conduct of the 21 22 affairs of the district generally, and for other purposes, 23 which may be added an amount to be held as a reserve. District 24 administrative and operating expenses must be identified in 25 the budget and allocated among district programs. The budget shall also show the estimated amount 26 (2)27 which will appear at the beginning of the fiscal year as obligated upon commitments made but uncompleted. There shall 28 29 be shown the estimated unobligated or net balance which will 30 be on hand at the beginning of the fiscal year, and the estimated amount to be raised by district taxes and from other 31 2

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sources for meeting the requirements of the district. 1 2 (d) (d) (3) As provided in s. 200.065(2)(d), the board 3 shall publish one or more notices of its intention to finally 4 adopt a final budget for the district for the ensuing fiscal 5 year. The notice shall appear adjacent to an advertisement that sets which shall set forth the tentative budget in a б 7 format meeting the budget summary requirements of s. 129.03(3)(b) in full. The district shall not include 8 expenditures of federal special revenues and state special 9 10 revenues when preparing the statement required by s. 200.065(3)(1). The notice and advertisement shall be published 11 12 in one or more newspapers having a combined general paid 13 circulation in each county the counties having land in which the district lies. Districts may include explanatory phrases 14 15 and examples in budget advertisements published under s. 16 200.065 to clarify or illustrate the effect that the district 17 budget may have on ad valorem taxes. 18 (e) (4) The hearing for adoption of to finally adopt a final budget and millage rate shall be by and before the 19 20 governing board of the district as provided in s. 200.065 and may be continued from day to day until terminated by the 21 board. 22 (4) BUDGET CONTROLS. --23 24 (a) The final adopted budget for the district will 25 thereupon be the operating and fiscal guide for the district for the ensuing year; however, transfers of funds may be made 26 27 within the budget by action of the governing board at a public meeting of the governing board. 28 29 (b) The district shall control its budget, at a 30 minimum, by funds and shall provide to the Executive Office of the Governor a description of its budget control mechanisms. 31 3 File original & 9 copies hep0001 04/25/01 06:45 pm 01221-0114-854149

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(c) Should the district receive unanticipated funds 1 2 after the adoption of the final budget, the final budget may be amended by including such funds, so long as notice of 3 4 intention to amend is published in the notice of the governing board meeting at which the amendment will be considered, 5 pursuant to s. 120.525 one time in one or more newspapers б 7 qualified to accept legal advertisements having a combined 8 qeneral circulation in the counties in the district. The notice shall set forth a summary of the proposed amendment and 9 10 shall be published at least 10 days prior to the public 11 meeting of the board at which the proposed amendment is to be 12 considered. However, in the event of a disaster or of an 13 emergency arising to prevent or avert the same, the governing 14 board shall not be limited by the budget but shall have 15 authority to apply such funds as may be available therefor or as may be procured for such purpose. 16 17 (5) TENTATIVE BUDGET CONTENTS AND SUBMISSION; REVIEW 18 AND APPROVAL. --The Executive Office of the Governor is authorized 19 (a) 20 to approve or disapprove, in whole or in part, the budget of each water management district and shall analyze each budget 21 as to the adequacy of fiscal resources available to the 22 district and the adequacy of district expenditures related to 23 24 water supply, including water resource development projects 25 identified in the district's regional water supply plans; water quality; flood protection and floodplain management; and 26 27 natural systems. This analysis shall be based on the particular needs within each water management district in 28 29 those four areas of responsibility. 30 (b) The Executive Office of the Governor and the water management districts shall develop a process to facilitate 31

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review and communication regarding water management district 1 2 budgets, as necessary. Written disapproval of any provision 3 in the tentative budget must be received by the district at 4 least 5 business days prior to the final district budget adoption hearing conducted under s. 200.065(2)(d). If written 5 6 disapproval of any portion of the budget is not received at 7 least 5 business days prior to the final budget adoption hearing, the governing board may proceed with final adoption. 8 9 Any provision rejected by the Governor shall not be included 10 in a district's final budget.

(c) Each water management district shall, by August 1 11 12 of each year, submit for review a tentative budget to the 13 Governor, the President of the Senate, the Speaker of the House of Representatives, the chairs of all legislative 14 15 committees and subcommittees with substantive or fiscal 16 jurisdiction over water management districts, as determined by 17 the President of the Senate or Speaker of the House of 18 Representatives as applicable, the secretary of the department, and the governing body of each county in which the 19 district has jurisdiction or derives any funds for the 20 operations of the district. 21

The tentative budget must set forth the proposed 22 (d) expenditures of the district, to which may be added an amount 23 24 to be held as reserve. The tentative budget must include, but is not limited to, the following information for the preceding 25 fiscal year and the current fiscal year, and the proposed 26 27 amounts for the upcoming fiscal year, in a standard format prescribed by the Executive Office of the Governor which is 28 29 generally consistent with the format prescribed by legislative 30 budget instructions for state agencies and the format

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31 requirements of s. 216.031:

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The estimated amount of funds remaining at the 1 1. 2 beginning of the fiscal year which have been obligated for the 3 payment of outstanding commitments not yet completed. 4 2. The estimated amount of unobligated funds or net 5 cash balance on hand at the beginning of the fiscal year, and 6 the estimated amount of funds to be raised by district taxes 7 or received from other sources to meet the requirements of the 8 district. 3. The millage rates and the percentage increase above 9 10 the rolled-back rate, together with a summary of the reasons the increase is required, and the percentage increase in 11 12 taxable value resulting from new construction within the 13 district.+ 14 4.2. The salaries salary and benefits, expenses, 15 operating capital outlay, number of authorized positions, and other personal services for the following program areas of the 16 17 district, including a separate section for lobbying, 18 intergovernmental relations, and advertising: 19 a. Water resource planning and monitoring; b. Land acquisition, restoration, and public works; 20 c. Operation and maintenance of works and lands; 21 22 d. Regulation; e. Outreach for which the information provided must 23 24 contain a full description and accounting of expenditures for 25 water resources education; public information and public relations, including public service announcements and 26 27 advertising in any media; and lobbying activities related to local, regional, state and federal governmental affairs, 28 29 whether incurred by district staff or through contractual 30 services; and 31 f. Management and administration. 6

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1 District management and administration; 2 b. Implementation through outreach activities; 3 Implementation through regulation; с. 4 d. Implementation through acquisition, restoration, 5 and public works; e. Implementation through operations and maintenance б 7 of lands and works; 8 f. Water resources planning and monitoring; and q. A full description and accounting of expenditures 9 10 for lobbying activities relating to local, regional, state, and federal governmental affairs, whether incurred by district 11 12 staff or through contractual services and all expenditures for 13 public relations, including all expenditures for public 14 service announcements and advertising in any media. 15 16 In addition to the program areas reported by all water 17 management districts, the South Florida Water Management District shall include in its budget document $\frac{1}{2}$ separate 18 sections section on all costs associated with the Everglades 19 Construction Project and the Comprehensive Everglades 20 Restoration Plan. 21 22 5.3. The total estimated amount in the district budget for each area of responsibility listed in subparagraph 4. 23 24 paragraph (a) and for water resource development projects 25 identified in the district's regional water supply plans. 4. A 5-year capital improvements plan. 26 27 6.5. A description of each new, expanded, reduced, or 28 eliminated program. 29 6. A proposed 5-year water resource development work 30 program, that describes the district's implementation strategy 31 for the water resource development component of each approved 7

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regional water supply plan developed or revised pursuant to 1 2 373.0361. The work program shall address all the elements 3 the water resource development component in the district's 4 approved regional water supply plans. The office of the 5 Governor, with the assistance of the department, shall review the proposed work program. The review shall include a written б 7 evaluation of its consistency with and furtherance of the 8 district's approved regional water supply plans, and adequacy of proposed expenditures. As part of the review, the Executive 9 10 Office of the Governor and the department shall afford to all 11 interested parties the opportunity to provide written comments 12 on each district's proposed work program. At least 7 days 13 prior to the adoption of its final budget, the governing board 14 shall state in writing to the Executive Office of the Governor 15 which changes recommended in the evaluation it will incorporate into its work program, or specify the reasons for 16 17 not incorporating the changes. The office of the Governor shall include the district's responses in the written 18 19 evaluation and shall submit a copy of the evaluation to the 20 Legislature; and

7. The funding sources, including, but not limited to,
ad valorem taxes, Surface Water Improvement and Management
Program funds, other state funds, federal funds, and user fees
and permit fees for each program area.

25 <u>(e)(d)</u> By September 5 of the year in which the budget 26 is submitted, the House and Senate appropriations chairs may 27 transmit to each district comments and objections to the 28 proposed budgets. Each district governing board shall include 29 a response to such comments and objections in the record of 30 the governing board meeting where final adoption of the budget 31 takes place, and the record of this meeting shall be

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transmitted to the Executive Office of the Governor, the 1 2 department, and the chairs of the House and Senate 3 appropriations committees. 4 (f)(e) The Executive Office of the Governor shall 5 annually, on or before December 15, file with the Legislature 6 a report that summarizes its review the expenditures of the 7 water management districts' tentative budgets and displays the 8 adopted budget allocations districts by program area. The 9 report must identify and identifies the districts that are not 10 in compliance with the reporting requirements of this section. State funds shall be withheld from a water management district 11 12 that fails to comply with these reporting requirements. 13 (6) FINAL BUDGET; ANNUAL AUDIT; CAPITAL IMPROVEMENTS PLAN; WATER RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT WORK PROGRAM. --14 15 (a) Each district must, by the date specified for each item, furnish copies of the following documents to the 16 17 Governor, the President of the Senate, the Speaker of the 18 House of Representatives, the chairs of all legislative committees and subcommittees having substantive or fiscal 19 jurisdiction over the districts, as determined by the 20 21 President or Speaker as applicable, the secretary of the department, and the governing board of each county in which 22 the district has jurisdiction or derives any funds for the 23 24 operations of the district; The adopted budget, to be furnished within 10 days 25 1. 26 after its adoption. 27 2. A financial audit of its accounts and records, to 28 be furnished within 10 days after its acceptance by the 29 governing board. The audit must be conducted in accordance 30 with the provisions of s. 11.45 and the rules adopted thereunder. In addition to the entities named above, the 31 9

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district must provide a copy of the audit to the Auditor 1 2 General within 10 days after its acceptance by the governing 3 board. 4 3. A 5-year capital improvements plan, to be furnished 5 within 45 days after the adoption of the final budget. The 6 plan must include expected sources of revenue for planned 7 improvements and must be prepared in a manner comparable to the fixed capital outlay format set forth in s. 216.043. 8 4. A 5-year water resource development work program to 9 10 be furnished within 45 days after the adoption of the final budget. The program must describe the district's 11 12 implementation strategy for the water resource development 13 component of each approved regional water supply plan developed or revised under s. 373.0361. The work program must 14 15 address all the elements of the water resource development component in the district's approved regional water supply 16 17 plans. Within 45 days after its submittal, the department 18 shall review the proposed work program and submit its findings, questions, and comments to the district. The review 19 must include a written evaluation of the program's consistency 20 21 with the furtherance of the district's approved regional water supply plans, and the adequacy of proposed expenditures. As 22 part of the review, the department shall give interested 23 parties the opportunity to provide written comments on each 24 district's proposed work program. Within 60 days after receipt 25 of the department's evaluation, the governing board shall 26 27 state in writing to the department which changes recommended 28 in the evaluation it will incorporate into its work program or 29 specify the reasons for not incorporating the changes. The 30 department shall include the district's responses in a final evaluation report and shall submit a copy of the report to the 31 10

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Governor, the President of the Senate, and the Speaker of the 1 2 House of Representatives. (b) If any entity listed in paragraph (a) provides 3 4 written comments to the district regarding any document 5 furnished under this subsection, the district must respond to 6 the comments in writing and furnish copies of the comments and 7 written responses to the other entities. Section 8. Paragraph (b) of subsection (4) of section 8 373.079, Florida Statutes, is amended to read: 9 10 373.079 Members of governing board; oath of office; staff.--11 12 (4) 13 (b)1. The governing board of each water management 14 district shall employ an inspector general, who shall report 15 directly to the board. However, the governing boards of the Suwannee River Water Management District and the Northwest 16 17 Florida Water Management District may jointly employ an inspector general, or provide for inspector general services 18 by interagency agreement with a state agency or water 19 20 management district inspector general. 21 An inspector general must have the qualifications 2. prescribed and perform the applicable duties of state agency 22 inspectors general as provided in s. 20.055. 23 24 3. Within 45 days of the adoption of the final budget, 25 the governing board shall submit a 5-year capital improvement plan and fiscal report for the district to the Governor, the 26 27 President of the Senate, the Speaker of the House of Representatives, and the Secretary of Environmental 28 29 Protection. The capital improvement plan must include expected 30 sources of revenue for planned improvements and shall be prepared in a manner comparable to the fixed capital outlay 31 11

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format set forth in s. 216.043. The fiscal report shall cover 1 2 the preceding fiscal year and shall include a summary 3 statement of the financial operations of the district. 4 Section 9. Section 373.501, Florida Statutes, is 5 amended to read: 373.501 Appropriation of funds to water management б 7 districts.--8 (1) The department may allocate to the water 9 management districts, from funds appropriated to the 10 department, such sums as may be deemed necessary to defray the costs of the administrative, regulatory, and other activities 11 12 of the districts. The governing boards shall submit annual budget requests for such purposes to the department, and the 13 14 department shall consider such budgets in preparing its budget 15 request for the Legislature. 16 (2) Funds appropriated by the Legislature for the 17 purpose of funding a specific water management district 18 project shall be transferred to the water management district when the proposed project has been reviewed by the secretary 19 of the pertinent state agency and upon receipt of a governing 20 board resolution requesting such funds. 21 Section 10. Subsection (11) of section 373.59, Florida 22 23 Statutes, is amended to read: 24 373.59 Water Management Lands Trust Fund .--25 (11) Notwithstanding any provision of this section to the contrary, and for the 2000-2001 fiscal year only, the 26 27 governing board of a water management district may request, and the Secretary of Environmental Protection shall release 28 29 upon such request, moneys allocated to the districts pursuant 30 to subsection (8) for the purpose of carrying out the purposes 31 consistent with the provisions of s. 373.0361, s. 373.0831 s. 12 File original & 9 copies hep0001 04/25/01
