- (b) Any person who is convicted of a third fourth or subsequent violation of this section within 10 years after the first of two or more convictions for a violation of this section is guilty of a felony of the third degree, punishable as provided in s. 775.082, s. 775.083, or s. 775.084; however, the minimum penalty fine imposed for such third fourth or subsequent violation shall may be a fine of not less than \$1,000 and a minimum mandatory term of imprisonment of 30 days.
- (c) Any person who is convicted of a fourth or subsequent violation of this section within 10 years after the first of three or more convictions for a violation of this section is guilty of a felony of the third degree, punishable as provided in s. 775.082, s. 775.083, or s. 775.084; however, the minimum penalty for such fourth or subsequent violation shall be a fine of not less than \$1,000 and a minimum mandatory term of imprisonment of 30 days.
- (d) Any person who is convicted of a violation of this section who at the time of the offense was operating a motor vehicle while his or her license or privilege was canceled, suspended, or revoked pursuant to this section or s. 322.2615 is guilty of a felony of the third degree, punishable as provided in s. 775.082, s. 775.083, or s. 775.084; however, the minimum penalty for such violation shall be a fine of not less than \$1,000 and a minimum mandatory term of imprisonment of 30 days.
- (e) Any person who is convicted of a violation of this section who at the time of the offense was operating a motor

vehicle with a license for driving privileges restricted
solely to business or employment purposes is guilty of a
felony of the third degree, punishable as provided in s.
775.082, s. 775.083, or s. 775.084; however, the minimum
penalty for such violation shall be a fine of not less than
\$1,000 and a minimum mandatory term of imprisonment of 30
days.

- (4) Any person who is convicted of a violation of subsection (1) and who has a blood-alcohol level or breath-alcohol level of 0.20 or higher, or any person who is convicted of a violation of subsection (1) and who at the time of the offense was accompanied in the vehicle by a person under the age of 18 years, shall be punished:
 - (a) By a fine of:
- 1. Not less than \$500 or more than \$1,000 for a first conviction.
- 2. Not less than \$1,000 or more than \$2,000 for a second conviction.
- 3. Not less than \$2,000 or more than \$5,000 for a third or subsequent conviction.

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One hundred dollars of each fine imposed under this paragraph shall be remitted to the county correctional facility in which the offender convicted of a violation of this subsection serves his or her term of imprisonment.
