(2) However, no such examination shall be necessary in any of the following cases:

(1) An applicant for license as a customer

representative who has the designation of Accredited Advisor in Insurance (AAI) from the Insurance Institute of America, the designation of Certified Insurance Counselor (CIC) from the Society of Certified Insurance Service Counselors, the designation of Accredited Customer Service Representative (ACSR) from the Independent Insurance Agents of America, the designation of Certified Professional Service Representative (CPSR) from the National Association of Professional Insurance

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Service Representatives. Also, an applicant for license as a
