Paragraph (a) of subsection (7) of section 947.1405, Florida Statutes, is amended to read: 12 13 947.1405 Conditional release program. --(7)(a) Any inmate who is convicted of a crime 14 committed on or after October 1, 1995, or who has been 15 16 previously convicted of a crime committed on or after October 1, 1995, in violation of chapter 794, s. 800.04, s. 827.071, 17 or s. 847.0145, and is subject to conditional release 18 19 supervision, shall have, in addition to any other conditions imposed, the following special conditions imposed by the 20 commission: 21 2.2 1. A mandatory curfew from 10 p.m. to 6 a.m. The court 23 may designate another 8-hour period if the offender's 24 employment precludes the above specified time, and such alternative is recommended by the Department of Corrections. 25 26 If the court determines that imposing a curfew would endanger the victim, the court may consider alternative sanctions. 27 28 2. If the victim was under the age of 18, a 29 prohibition on living within 1 mile 1,000 feet of a school, 30 day care center, park, playground, school bus stop, or other place where children regularly congregate. 31 1

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Active participation in and successful completion 1 3. 2 of a sex offender treatment program with therapists 3 specifically trained to treat sex offenders, at the releasee's own expense. If a specially trained therapist is not available 4 5 within a 50-mile radius of the releasee's residence, the б offender shall participate in other appropriate therapy. 7 4. A prohibition on any contact with the victim, 8 directly or indirectly, including through a third person, 9 unless approved by the victim, the offender's therapist, and 10 the sentencing court. 11 5. If the victim was under the age of 18, a 12 prohibition, until successful completion of a sex offender 13 treatment program, on unsupervised contact with a child under 14 the age of 18, unless authorized by the commission without another adult present who is responsible for the child's 15 16 welfare, has been advised of the crime, and is approved by the commission. 17 6. If the victim was under age 18, a prohibition on 18 working for pay or as a volunteer at any school, day care 19 center, park, playground, or other place where children 20 21 regularly congregate, as prescribed by the commission. 22 7. Unless otherwise indicated in the treatment plan provided by the sexual offender treatment program, a 23 prohibition on viewing, owning, or possessing any obscene, 24 pornographic, or sexually stimulating visual or auditory 25 26 material, including telephone, electronic media, computer 27 programs, or computer services that are relevant to the 28 offender's deviant behavior pattern. 8. A requirement that the releasee must submit two 29 specimens of blood to the Florida Department of Law 30 31 Enforcement to be registered with the DNA database.

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A requirement that the releasee make restitution to 9. the victim, as determined by the sentencing court or the commission, for all necessary medical and related professional services relating to physical, psychiatric, and psychological care. 10. Submission to a warrantless search by the community control or probation officer of the probationer's or community controllee's person, residence, or vehicle. Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2001.
