A bill to be entitled 1 2 An act relating to disability services; creating s. 402.74, F.S; creating the 3 4 Clearinghouse on Disability Information Office 5 in the Department of Management Services; requiring the office to establish a statewide 6 7 toll-free disability information and referral system; creating an advisory council; providing 8 9 qualifications for staff of the office; 10 providing for the sharing of information by 11 state agencies; providing for an annual report; 12 providing an effective date. 13 14 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida: 15 16 Section 1. Section 402.74, Florida Statutes, is 17 created to read: 402.74 Clearinghouse on Disability Information Office; 18 19 functions; advisory council; staff; collaborations; annual report.--20 21 (1) It is the intent of the Legislature that a 22 statewide system of disability service and resource 23 information be developed whereby individuals with disabilities, family members, professionals assisting 24 25 individuals with disabilities, and the public can easily ascertain information concerning disability-related services 26 27 and resources available in the state. 28 (2) The Clearinghouse on Disability Information Office 29 is created and administratively placed in the Department of 30 Management Services. The Department of Management Services shall provide administrative support to the Clearinghouse on

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28 29 Disability Information Office, including office space and assistance with personnel, accounting, and management-information systems. The Clearinghouse on Disability Information Office is not subject to control, supervision, or direction by the Department of Management Services in the performance of its duties. The Clearinghouse on Disability Information Office shall annually prepare a budget request that is not to be changed by the department, but shall be transmitted to the Governor for transmittal to the Legislature.

(3) The Clearinghouse on Disability Information Office shall develop and maintain a statewide toll-free information and referral system that provides information and referral for all disability-related services, programs, assistance, and resources, as well as generic services and assistance that individuals having disabilities and their families may need. The purpose of this information and referral system is to ease the complexity of systems that individuals having disabilities and their families must identify and navigate in order to secure the assistance needed by providing both information on where to find the service and an understanding of the processes required to access the service. It is recognized that a significant disability-related and generic information and referral infrastructure already exists in this state. Therefore, the Clearinghouse on Disability Information Office is to provide a central point through which a user is directed to existing information and referral systems and, when no such system exists, other disability resources to address the user's questions or needs.

- (j) Advertise statewide the availability of the toll-free information and referral system.
- Office shall establish an advisory council, not to exceed 20 members, to assist the office in planning and developing its services. The advisory council shall meet at least four times each year. The office shall rely on the advisory council for advice and technical assistance in establishing and operating its delineated functions, including, but not limited to:
- 1. Collaborating with the disability-related programs, services, and organizations;
- 2. Using existing information and referral systems, both telephone and web-site based, where available;
- 3. Creating a system that is accepted and used by the disability community;
- 4. Forming linkages through which important changes in the disability services and systems could be provided to the office and through which the services of the office could be provided to the disability community;
- 5. Developing the services and systems for performing the identified office functions; and
- $\underline{\text{6. Recommending improvements to the services and}}\\$ systems of the office.
- (b) Members of the advisory council shall include representatives of state agency disability services and programs, statewide organizations providing disability-related information and referral systems, statewide organizations representing disability populations or disability services, and statewide organizations representing the generic information and referral systems. At least one-third of the advisory council members must be individuals having

disabilities or family members of individuals having disabilities. Representatives of state agencies may not 2 3 comprise more than one-third of the advisory council. Members of the advisory council must reflect the diversity of the 4 5 population and disabilities found in the state. Appointments 6 to the advisory council shall be made in the following manner: 7 two members by the Secretary of Children and Family Services, 8 two members by the Commissioner of Education, two members by the Secretary of Elderly Affairs, two members by the Secretary 9 10 of Health, one member by the Secretary of Management Services, 11 one member by the Secretary of Transportation, and one member by the head of the Agency for Health Care Administration. The 12 specified appointees shall identify the remaining members of 13 the advisory council. Advisory council members shall serve 14 without compensation, but are entitled to reimbursement for 15 per diem and travel expenses as provided in s. 112.061. 16 17 Reimbursement for travel expenses includes personal assistance 18 services for individuals with disabilities who require such 19 services. (6) Staff to the Clearinghouse on Disability 20 21 Information Office shall consist of a director, information specialist, and support staff, at a minimum, who will be 22 dedicated solely to performing the functions of this office. 23 24 Those staff that will be working directly with information and 25 referral system users must have experience in the disability field. Strong consideration must be given to individuals 26 27 having a disability or family members of individuals having a 28 disability. The director must have a minimum of 5 years of 29 experience in the disability field and, preferably, experience 30 with information and referral services. The Department of

Management Services shall select the director from three

candidates recommended by the advisory council, each of whom must meet the state requirements for the position. The 2 3 candidates for the first director selected shall be recommended by a selection committee composed of the President 4 5 of The ABLE Trust, the Executive Director of the Family 6 Network on Disabilities, Inc., a member of the Board of 7 Directors of the Florida Alliance of Information and Referral 8 Services, the Bureau Chief of the Department of Health, Brain, and Spinal Cord Injury Program, the Executive Administrator 9 for the Governor's Working Group on the Americans with 10 11 Disabilities Act, and an individual having a developmental disability or a parent of an individual having a developmental 12 disability to be appointed by the Secretary of Children and 13 Family Services. The director of the office shall select the 14 remaining staff for the office, each of whom must meet the 15 state requirements for the positions. 16 17 The state agencies providing services for individuals having disabilities or their families shall 18 19 collaborate with the Clearinghouse on Disability Information Office in the sharing of information necessary to establish 20 and maintain the statewide information and referral system. 21 To the extent possible, the Clearinghouse on 22 (8) Disability Information Office will adopt professional 23 24 standards of information and referral that will facilitate common data-sharing and quality assurance. The office shall 25 collaborate with the Florida Alliance of Information and 26 27 Referral Services to assist with the goal of forming a statewide information and 211 network. 28 29 (9) All components of the program and delivery of

services must fully comply with the Americans with

1 (10) Initially, the toll-free statewide information and referral system established by the Clearinghouse on 2 3 Disability Information Office shall consist of a base of state-level resources and services, including the federal 4 5 social security disability income program and supplemental 6 security income program. The state-level resources and 7 services shall include state agencies providing services for individuals having disabilities, statewide disability-specific 8 9 information and referral systems, statewide disability organizations having resources to assist with 10 11 disability-related issues, and statewide generic information and referral systems. Once a base of state-level resources and 12 services has been established, the office, with the assistance 13 of the advisory council, will examine and determine how to 14 capture and provide linkages to local community-based 15 services, both disability-specific and generic, without 16 17 duplicating existing information and referral systems. The capturing and providing of linkages to local community-based 18 services must use existing state and local information and 19 referral and service systems, where available. When gaps in 20 21 disability information are identified at the local level, local information and referral and service systems should be 22 used to the fullest extent possible to secure the information. 23 24 (11) The Clearinghouse on Disability Information 25 Office shall annually prepare a report describing the services 26 provided by the office and submit the report by December 31 to 27 the Governor, to the President of the Senate, to the Speaker of the House of Representatives, and to each state agency 28 offering services for individuals having disabilities. This 29 30 report must include, but is not limited to, a description of 31 the resources contained in and types of services offered

through the information and referral system, data concerning the requests received, activities of the advisory council, an explanation of the office's compliance with the delineated functions, and improvements made to the system. Section 2. This act shall take effect upon becoming a law. SENATE SUMMARY Creates the Clearinghouse on Disability Information Office within the Department of Management Services to administer a statewide system of disability service and resource information.
