A bill to be entitled 1 2 An act relating to teacher recruitment; creating the Transition to Teaching Program; 3 4 encouraging participation by postsecondary 5 education institutions and organizations that 6 represent eligible employees or employ eligible 7 applicants; providing for grant proposals and applications; requiring an evaluation; 8 9 authorizing certain activities and placing limitations on expenditures; providing for 10 repayment of certain stipends; providing an 11 12 effective date. 13 WHEREAS, Florida's public school enrollment has 14 increased by over 200,000 students in the past 5 years, and 15 16 WHEREAS, Florida's supply of teachers for these 17 students is inadequate, with over 15,000 vacancies expected in 2001-2002, and 18 19 WHEREAS, the successful Troops to Teachers Program has 20 recruited over 3,000 retired service men and women into a 21 teaching career, over 200 in Florida, and 22 WHEREAS, on December 15, 2000, Representative Jim Davis and Senator Bob Graham secured a federal appropriation of \$34 23 million for a program, modeled after Troops to Teachers, for 24 25 career-changing professionals to enter the teaching field, NOW, THEREFORE, 26 27 28 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida: 29 30 Section 1. Transition to Teaching Program; Legislative intent. -- The Transition to Teaching Program is created to

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encourage and assist mid-career professionals who want to become teachers. It is intended to enable professional 2 3 associations, business and trade groups, unions, school districts, postsecondary education institutions, community 4 5 organizations, and other organizations to assist their 6 retiring employees who want to become teachers. Section 2. Grants; eligible applicants.--7 8 (1) A community college, state university, or 9

- independent college or university is eligible for a grant to implement the Transition to Teaching Program by working with firms that employ professionals or represent employees. A consortium of organizations is eligible, but it must include a postsecondary education institution. The Commissioner of Education shall design the process for receiving and evaluating grant proposals in accordance with state and federal appropriations guidelines. Grants may be awarded only to the extent that funding is provided.
- The Commissioner of Education shall request proposals from eligible applicants to participate in the program. Each application must:
- (a) Describe the target group of career-changing professionals upon which the applicant will focus in carrying out its program, including a description of the characteristics of the target group that shows how the knowledge and experience of its members are likely to improve their ability to become effective teachers.
- (b) Describe how the applicant will identify and recruit program participants.
- (c) Describe how the applicant will ensure that program participants are placed and teach in eligible school 31 districts in this state.

1	(d) Describe the teacher support services that program
2	participants will receive throughout at least their first year
3	of teaching.
4	(e) Describe how the applicant will collaborate with
5	other institutions, agencies, or organizations to recruit,
6	train, place, and support program participants, including
7	evidence of the commitment of those institutions, agencies, or
8	organizations to the applicant's program.
9	(3) The Commissioner of Education must require an
10	evaluation process to measure the progress and effectiveness
11	of the program. This evaluation must include:
12	(a) The program's goals and objectives.
13	(b) The performance indicators that the applicant will
14	use to measure the program's progress.
15	(c) The outcome measures that will be used to
16	determine the program's effectiveness.
17	(d) An assurance that the applicant will provide the
18	commissioner with information the commissioner finds necessary
19	to determine the overall effectiveness of the programs.
20	Section 3. Program funds; authorized expendituresAn
21	applicant shall estimate the funds required for the proposed
22	program. Funds may be used for:
23	(1) Recruiting program participants, including
24	informing them of opportunities under the program and putting
25	them in contact with other institutions, agencies, or
26	organizations that will train, place, and support them in the
27	teaching profession.
28	(2) Training stipends and other financial incentives
29	for program participants, in an amount not to exceed \$5,000

1	(3) Assisting higher education institutions or other
2	providers of teacher training to tailor their training to meet
3	the particular needs of professionals who are changing their
4	careers to teaching.
5	(4) Placement activities, including identifying
6	eligible local education agencies that need the skills and
7	characteristics of the newly trained program participants and
8	assisting those participants to obtain employment in those
9	school districts.
10	(5) Post-placement support activities for program
11	participants.
12	Section 4. Eligible participants; requirements for
13	grant repayment
14	(1) Each participant who receives a grant from the
15	program to pursue a teacher-preparation program must agree to
16	teach in an eligible school district in this state for at
17	least 3 years after certification. To be eligible, a school
18	district must meet the requirements established in regulations
19	that implement the Omnibus Appropriations Bill of 2000.
20	(2) The commissioner shall establish conditions under
21	which a participant must repay all or a portion of the
22	training stipend if the participant fails to complete his or
23	her service obligation.
24	Section 5. This act shall take effect July 1, 2001.
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SENATE SUMMARY Creates the Transition to Teaching Program. Encourages participation by postsecondary education institutions and organizations that represent eligible employees or employ eligible applicants. Provides for grant proposals and applications. Requires an evaluation. Authorizes certain activities and places limitations on expenditures. Provides for the repayment of certain stipends awarded to participants who do not complete their obligations under the program.
