STATEMENT OF SUBSTANTIAL CHANGES CONTAINED IN COMMITTEE SUBSTITUTE FOR Senate Bill 170 Committee Substitute for Senate Bill 170 is different from Senate Bill 170 in that it: --Changes the appropriations for citrus canker compensation. -- General Revenue Fund Appropriation from \$45 million to \$40 million -- Florida Citrus Advertising Trust Fund from \$5 million to \$10 million --Makes technical corrections. --Deletes an amendment to  $\rm s.581.184$ , F.S., that clarifies that compensation for trees removed from nonresidential property within the buffer zone is subject to annual legislative appropriation. --Changes the retroactive date for providing compensation from January 1, 2000 to January 1, 1995.
