Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

Section 1. One or more professional development academies shall be established to meet the human resource development needs of professional educators, schools, and school districts. Funds appropriated for the initiation of professional development academies must be allocated by the Commissioner of Education, unless otherwise provided in an appropriations act. To be eligible for startup funds, an academy must:

(1) Be established by the collaborative efforts of one or more district school boards, members of the business community, and the postsecondary institutions that will award college credits for courses taught at the academy.

(2) Demonstrate the ability to provide high-quality trainers and training and appropriate followup and coaching for all participants and to support school personnel in improving students' performance.

- partners and governed by an independent board of directors that should include at least one school superintendent and one school board chair from the participating school districts, the president of the collective bargaining unit that represents the majority of the region's teachers, and at least three individuals who are not employees or elected or appointed officials of the participating school districts.

 Regional educational consortia as defined in s. 228.0857, Florida Statutes, satisfy the requirements of this subsection.
- (4) Be financed during the first year of operation by an equal or greater match from private funding sources and demonstrate the ability to be self-supporting within 1 year after opening through fees for services, grants, or private contributions. Regional educational consortia as defined in s. 228.0857, Florida Statutes, are exempt from the funding match required by this subsection.
- (5) Own or lease a facility that can be used to deliver training onsite and through distance learning and other technology-based delivery systems. The participating district school boards may lease a site or facility to the academy for a nominal fee and may pay all or part of the costs of renovating a facility to accommodate the academy. The academy is responsible for all operational, maintenance, and repair costs.
- (6) Provide professional development services for the participating school districts as specified in the contract.

 An academy may provide professional development services to other school districts, private schools, and individuals on a fee-for-service basis.

If the majority of counties in a regional educational consortium have been designated as "rural areas of critical economic concern" by the Governor in Executive Order 99-275 or subsequent executive orders, all counties and their respective school districts served by the consortium are eligible to receive benefits under this section. Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2001.
