A bill to be entitled

An act relating to postsecondary education; authorizing the Board of Regents and the State Board of Community Colleges, in implementing a single, statewide computer-assisted student advising system, to secure and enforce patents on work products, enter into various agreements, and sell work products; providing for any or all of the proceeds derived from such activities to be used to develop and maintain the computer-assisted student advising system; requiring review and comment by legislative leaders; providing an effective date.

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

Section 1. (1) In implementing the single, statewide computer-assisted student advising system required under section 240.2099, Florida Statutes, the Board of Regents and the State Board of Community Colleges may:

(a) Perform all things necessary to secure letters of patent, copyrights, and trademarks on any work products and enforce their rights with respect thereto.

(b) Enter into binding agreements with organizations, corporations, or government entities to license, lease, assign, or otherwise give written consent to any person, firm, corporation, or agency for the use of the single, statewide, computer-assisted student advising system and collect royalties or any other consideration that the boards find

1	(c) Sell or license any such work products and execute
2	all instruments necessary to consummate the sale or license.
3	(d) The Board of Regents and the State Board of
4	Community Colleges shall submit to the President of the Senate
5	and the Speaker of the House of Representatives any agreement
6	relating to this act. The President and Speaker may review the
7	terms of the agreement and respond with comments for 30 days
8	after receipt of an agreement; after that time, the agreement
9	is binding.
10	(2) All or a portion of the proceeds derived from
11	activities authorized under this section may be expended for

14	Section 2. This act shall take effect upon becoming a
