A bill to be entitled 1 An act relating to driver licensing; creating 2 3 the Driver Licensing Study Commission within the Department of Highway Safety and Motor 4 5 Vehicles; providing for membership and appointment; providing for staff; providing for 6 7 duties of the commission; providing for 8 dissolution of the commission upon submission 9 of a required report; providing an appropriation; providing an effective date. 10 11 12 WHEREAS, outsourcing through public-private 13 partnerships has been successfully implemented in the State of 14 Florida across a broad range of functions, and 15 WHEREAS, the Legislature is constantly seeking to find 16 additional ways to provide high-quality services at lower costs for the citizens of the State of Florida, and 17 WHEREAS, driver licensing shows promise as an area 18 where public-private partnership would benefit the citizens of 19 20 the State of Florida, NOW, THEREFORE, 21 22 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida: 23 24 Section 1. Driver Licensing Study Commission 25 created.--26 (1) The Driver Licensing Study Commission is created 27 within the Department of Highway Safety and Motor 28 Vehicles. The commission shall consist of eight members, to 29 be appointed as follows: 30 31

- (a) The Speaker of the House of Representatives shall appoint two members, at least one of whom must have business managerial experience in the private sector.
- (b) The President of the Senate shall appoint two members, at least one of whom must have business managerial experience in the private sector.
- (c) The Governor shall appoint three members, at least one of whom must have information technology experience relating to systems utilizing complex databases.
- (d) The Executive Director of the Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles shall serve as an ex officio, nonvoting member of the commission.
- (2) The commission shall elect a chair and a vice chair from its membership at its first meeting.
- (3) The commission shall be appointed no later than June 15, 2001, and its first meeting shall be held no later than July 15, 2001. The commission shall meet periodically at the request of the chair.
- (3) Members of the commission shall serve without compensation, except for per diem and reimbursement for travel expenses as provided by s. 112.061, Florida Statutes.
- (4) A vacancy in the commission shall be filled within 30 days after its occurrence in the same manner as the original appointment.
- Vehicles shall serve as primary staff to the commission,

 providing technical and administrative assistance and ensuring that commission meetings are electronically recorded. Such recordings shall be preserved pursuant to chs. 119 and 257,

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1	(6) The commission shall study and make
2	recommendations on the feasibility of using privatization,
3	outsourcing, and public-private partnership techniques in the
4	delivery of driver's license services. The commission shall
5	review local government driver's licensing programs and shall
6	review results available from driver's licensing privatization
7	pilot projects in the state. The study shall address the
8	following issues:
9	(a) Identification of functions that are appropriate
10	for privatization or outsourcing and functions for which the
11	public sector should maintain direct control.
12	(b) Technology and re-engineering of business

- (b) Technology and re-engineering of business processes to achieve greater efficiencies, ultimately
- (c) The format and type of necessary procurement procedures and oversight and audit mechanisms to protect the interests of the State of Florida in dealings with private service providers.
- (d) Contractual controls to ensure appropriate service delivery and customer satisfaction levels.
 - (e) Safeguards for control of personal information.
- (f) Ways to encourage the use of alternative service delivery options.
- (g) Service center size and location to ensure that the public is best served.
- (h) Issues related to utilization and placement of current public driver's license employees in public-private licensing enterprises.
- (i) Any other issues the commission deems relevant to the privatization of drivers licensing functions.

The commission shall prepare an initial report of 1 2 its findings and recommendations on the issues listed in 3 subsection (6) and shall submit the report to the Governor, 4 the Speaker of the House of Representatives, and the President of the Senate on or before January 1, 2002. The commission 5 shall prepare a final report of its findings and 6 7 recommendations, taking into consideration the results of any 8 pilot projects for delivery of driver's license services, and 9 shall submit the report to the Governor, the Speaker of the House of Representatives, and the President of the Senate on 10 11 or before January 1, 2003. The commission is dissolved at the time it submits its final report. 12 13 Section 2. There is appropriated from the Highway Safety Operating Trust Fund to the Driver Licensing Study 14 Commission the sum of \$100,000 for the purpose of conducting 15 16 the study described in section 1. 17 Section 3.
