At a minimum, the task force shall 9 10 submit a report to the Legislature which includes a summary of 11 the method of allocation and distribution of organs; a list of 12 facilities performing multiple organ transplants and the 13 number being performed; the number of Medicaid and charity 14 care patients who have received organ transplants by existing 15 organ transplant programs; suggested mechanisms for funding organ transplants, which shall include, but need not limited 16 17 to, an organ transplant trust fund for the treatment of 18 Medicaid and charity patients; the impact of trends in health care delivery and financing on organ transplantation; and the 19 number of certificates of need applications reviewed by the 20 Agency for Health Care Administration in the last 5 years, 21 22 including the number approved or denied and the number 23 litigated. 24 (4) The task force shall meet at the call of the 25 chairperson.
