Taylor, Jr., б 7 caused by the negligence of a Hillsborough 8 County School Board employee; providing an effective date. 9 10 WHEREAS, on April 24, 1998, 21-year-old Richard F. 11 12 Taylor, Jr., was driving his motorcycle in a lawful manner 13 heading south on U.S. 301 in Hillsborough County, and 14 WHEREAS, at the same time, a Hillsborough County school bus operated by a driver employed by the Hillsborough County 15 16 School Board pulled out from a stop sign and attempted to cross the southbound lanes of U.S. 301 directly in the path of 17 Richard Taylor's motorcycle, and 18 19 WHEREAS, although Mr. Taylor attempted to stop his 20 motorcycle from colliding with the bus, he was unable to do 21 so, and 22 WHEREAS, as a result of the collision of the school bus with his motorcycle, Mr. Taylor suffered trauma to the head 23 24 and was pronounced dead at the scene, and 25 WHEREAS, an eyewitness to the accident observed the 26 school bus pull out in front of the motorcycle in violation of 27 the motorcycle's right-of-way, observed the motorcycle attempt 28 to stop, and observed the collision, and WHEREAS, Richard F. Taylor, Jr., was survived by his 29 mother, Alana Kelly, and his father, Richard F. Taylor, Sr., 30 31 who have lost their only son and their only child, and 1

1 WHEREAS, a lawsuit was filed against the Hillsborough 2 County School Board for the wrongful death of Richard F. 3 Taylor, Jr., and 4 WHEREAS, at the conclusion of the trial, the jury found the Hillsborough County School Board 75 percent at fault for 5 6 the death of Richard F. Taylor, Jr. and entered a verdict for 7 \$402,444, and 8 WHEREAS, after proper reductions for comparative fault, 9 the judge entered a final judgment in favor of the claimants for a total of \$301,833, and 10 11 WHEREAS, the Hillsborough County School Board did not 12 appeal the verdict and judgment, and 13 WHEREAS, the Hillsborough County School Board has paid 14 \$200,000 to the claimants pursuant to the limits of liability set forth in section 768.28, Florida Statutes, leaving an 15 16 unpaid judgment amount of \$101,833, NOW, THEREFORE, 17 18 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida: 19 20 Section 1. The facts stated in the preamble to this 21 act are found and declared to be true. 22 Section 2. The Hillsborough County School Board is authorized and directed to appropriate from funds of the 23 school board not otherwise appropriated and to draw a warrant 24 in the sum of \$50,000 payable to Alana Kelly, as compensation 25 26 for the death of her son, Richard F. Taylor, Jr., due to the 27 negligence of the Hillsborough County School Board. 28 Section 3. The Hillsborough County School Board is 29 authorized and directed to appropriate from funds of the school board not otherwise appropriated and to draw a warrant 30 in the sum of \$51,833 payable to Richard F. Taylor, Sr., as 31

compensation for the death of his son, Richard F. Taylor, Jr., due to the negligence of the Hillsborough County School Board. Section 4. This act shall take effect upon becoming a law.

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
