100.061 First primary election.—In each year in which a general election is held, a first primary election for nomination of candidates of political parties shall be held on the <u>first</u> Tuesday <u>after the first Monday in August 9 weeks</u> prior to the general election. Each candidate receiving a majority of the votes cast in each contest in the first primary election shall be declared nominated for such office. A second primary election shall be held as provided by s. 100.091 in every contest in which a candidate does not receive a majority.

Section 3. Effective January 1, 2004, subsection (1) of section 100.091, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

100.091 Second primary election.--

(1) In each year in which a general election is held, a second primary election for nomination of candidates of political parties where nominations were not made in the first primary election shall be held on the second Tuesday after the first Monday in September 5 weeks prior to the general election.

Section 4. <u>Paragraph (c) of subsection (7) of section</u> 101.62, Florida Statutes, is repealed.
