Section 1. Paragraph (f) is added to subsection (8) of
section 112.363, Florida Statutes, to read:

112.363 Retiree health insurance subsidy.--

(8) CONTRIBUTIONS.--For purposes of funding the
insurance subsidy provided by this section:

(f) Beginning July 1, 2001, the employer of each
member of a state-administered plan shall contribute 1.11
percent of gross compensation each pay period.

Such contributions shall be submitted to the Department of
Management Services and deposited in the Retiree Health
Insurance Subsidy Trust Fund.

Section 2. Paragraph (c) of subsection (7) of section
121.052, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

 2 Section 6. The Legislature finds that a proper and
 3 legitimate state purpose is served when employees, officers,
 4 and retirees of the state and of its political subdivisions,
 5 and the dependents, survivors, and beneficiaries of such
 6 employees, officers, and retirees, are extended the basic
 7 protections afforded governmental retirement systems that
 8 provide fair and adequate benefits, including health insurance
 9 subsidies, and that are managed, administered, and funded in a
 10 reasonable manner. Therefore, the Legislature hereby
 11 determines and declares that the provisions of this act
 12 fulfill an important state interest.
