HOUSE SUMMARY

Revises a provision of law which sets aside twelve dollars and fifty cents from each moving traffic violation in a county to fund that county's participation in an intergovernmental radio communication program. Provides that if the county is not participating in such a program, or if a municipality maintains a radio communication program independent of the county, funds collected must be used to fund local enforcement automation and must be distributed to the municipality or special improvement district in which the violation occurred or to the county if the violation occurred within the unincorporated area of the county.
