(1) This act shall be known and may be cited as the "School Service Accountability Act of 2001."

- effective and cost-efficient noninstructional services.

  Accordingly, the Legislature believes that this intent is best served when school districts analyze the provision of student transportation services, food services, and facilities operations and maintenance services to determine the best balance between the costs associated with providing such services and the quality of the services provided. When this intent is better served by private-sector providers, it is the intent of the Legislature that school districts contract with such providers for these services. Any cost savings that result shall be redirected to educational services for students. It is the further intent of the Legislature that the review and cost analysis of noninstructional services be an ongoing, periodic activity of all school districts.
- (3) Each district school board shall analyze, or contract for the analysis of, the cost of providing student transportation services, food services, and facilities operations and maintenance services, as well as the level and quality of services associated with each such service, as follows:
- (a) By the end of the 2003-2004 fiscal year, each district school board shall analyze, or contract for the analysis of, the provision of student transportation services, food services, and facilities operations and maintenance services. A minimum of one analysis shall be conducted annually, unless all three analyses are completed prior to the end of the 2003-2004 fiscal year.

(b) Any district that, prior to July 1, 2001, contracts with a private-sector provider of any noninstructional service required by this section to be analyzed is not required to have an analysis of that service conducted. (c) The form and substance of the analysis shall be as provided to the Department of Education by the Florida School Boards Association and Florida TaxWatch.

This analysis shall be the basis of comparison for a request for proposals to be issued by a district school board for the provision of such services.

- (4) A district school board may issue a request for proposals from private-sector providers and may contract for the provision of any noninstructional services if, based on the analysis conducted pursuant to subsection (3), cost savings or an improved level and quality of service will result.
- (a) The form and substance of the request for proposals shall be as provided to the Department of Education by the Florida School Boards Association and Florida TaxWatch.
- (b) Within 30 days after the conclusion of the bid process, the district school board shall, at a regularly scheduled board meeting, discuss and disclose the responses to the request for proposals, including a comparison to the analysis required by subsection (3).
- (5) School districts may form consortia for the purpose of conducting analyses and issuing requests for proposals, unless otherwise prohibited by law for a specific noninstructional service.

- (6) Notwithstanding any other provision of law to the contrary, any cost savings realized by a school district as a result of the requirements of this section shall be retained by the school district and shall be used for the improvement of educational services for students, as determined by the district school board. Use of cost savings relating to the provision of food services realized by a school district shall be governed by federal regulations.

- (7) The Department of Education shall provide technical assistance to the district school boards relating to the implementation of the requirements of this section.
- (8) The Legislature shall annually include in the General Appropriations Act a sum sufficient to compensate school districts, in full or in part, for the cost associated with the required analysis, request for proposal development, and review for the listed noninstructional services, as follows:
- (a) School districts with less than 15,000 full-time equivalent students shall receive \$5,000.
- (b) School districts with 15,000 to 50,000 full-time equivalent students shall receive \$10,000.
- (c) School districts with 50,001 to 100,000 full-time equivalent students shall receive \$15,000.
- (d) School districts in excess of 100,000 full-time equivalent students shall receive \$20,000.

Any school district that, prior to July 1, 2001, contracts with a private-sector provider of noninstructional services required to be analyzed pursuant to subsection (3) shall retain the funds provided pursuant to this subsection as

3	(9) By January 1 annually, each district school board
4	shall report the results of implementation of this section to
