316-1795-01 A bill to be entitled 1 2 An act relating to public records; providing an 3 exemption from public records requirements for information identifying the location of 4 5 specified archaeological sites; providing an б expiration date; providing a finding of public 7 necessity; providing an effective date. 8 9 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida: 10 11 Section 1. Any information identifying the location of archaeological sites contained in site files or other records 12 13 maintained by the Division of Historical Resources of the 14 Department of State is exempt from the provisions of section 15 119.07(1), Florida Statutes, and Section 24(a) of Article I of 16 the State Constitution, if the Division of Historical Resources finds that disclosure of such information will 17 create a substantial risk of destruction or harm at such 18 sites. This section is subject to the Open Government Sunset 19 20 Review Act in accordance with section 119.15, Florida Statutes, and expires on October 2, 2006, unless reviewed and 21 22 reenacted by the Legislature. 23 Section 2. (1) The Legislature finds that it is a public necessity that information identifying the location of 24 archaeological sites be exempt and confidential from public 25 26 records requirements because the state has a serious problem 27 with archaeological looting. The exact location of an archaeological site should be exempt from disclosure if the 28 29 Division of Historical Resources determines that disclosure of the site location will create a substantial risk of harm, 30 theft, or destruction at the site. 31

1	(2) The Legislature also finds that the lack of
2	protection for sensitive sites puts the Federal Government in
3	a difficult position. The Federal Government is mandated to
4	share site-specific information with the Florida State
5	Historic Preservation Officer to comply with Section 106 of
6	the National Historic Preservation Act of 1966, as amended.
7	However, section 304 of the National Historic Preservation Act
8	of 1966, as amended, protects specific information concerning
9	the location and character of cultural resources, which
10	includes archaeological sites, when sharing that information
11	could place them in jeopardy.
12	(3) The Legislature further finds that this exemption
13	is required by the development of Geographic Information
14	System databases listing sites located in the Florida Master
15	Site File at the Florida Department of State. The Geographic
16	Information System is a valuable tool for recording
17	site-location and survey data for participating in research,
18	land-use planning, and site stewardship by land managers and
19	law enforcement officers. However, while this data can be
20	quickly disseminated to the public via the Internet,
21	protective measures must be placed on the sharing and use of
22	this data for sensitive archaeological locations.
23	(4) The Legislature also finds that new implementation
24	guidelines for the National Historic Preservation Act of 1966,
25	as amended, require increased consultation with federally
26	recognized tribes. The Legislature finds that managing
27	information concerning Native American sacred sites and sites
28	of cultural patrimony carries a responsibility of
29	confidentiality. Credible stewardship in these areas requires
30	the ability to protect sensitive information from public
31	dissemination.

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Section 3. This act shall take effect upon becoming a law. STATEMENT OF SUBSTANTIAL CHANGES CONTAINED IN COMMITTEE SUBSTITUTE FOR $\underline{SB\ 2124}$ б This CS corrects the following technical problems with the bill: It removes the reference to "cultural sites" in the statement of public necessity in subsection (1) of section 2; It corrects references to the National Historic Preservation Act and the Florida Site File; and Includes the word "in" after the word "participating" in subsection (3) of section 2.

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
