Section 5. Subsection (2) of section 765.1103, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

765.1103 Pain management and palliative care.--

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(2) Health care providers and practitioners regulated

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under chapter 458, chapter 459, or chapter 464 must, as

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appropriate, comply with a request for pain management or

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palliative care from a patient under their care or, for an

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incapacitated patient under their care, from a surrogate,

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proxy, guardian, or other representative permitted to make

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health care decisions for the incapacitated patient.

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Facilities regulated under chapter 400 or chapter 395 must

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comply with the pain management or palliative care measures

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ordered by the patient's physician.~~When the patient is~~

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~~receiving care as an admitted patient of a facility or a~~

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~~provider or is a subscriber of a health care facility, health~~
